## IN THE NAME OF GOD: FATHER, SON AND HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus sent his disciples for the mission to the world with these words, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them all the commands I gave you (Matthew 28:18-20). Before Jesus ascended into heaven, he breathed on his disciples the Spirit of God, the Holy Spirit and commanded them "as the Father has sent me, so am I sending you." God reveals himself to us as the Holy Trinity and to experience his inner self is an extraordinary gift to us.

This Sunday is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We turn our hearts and minds to this mystery of God in faith. The Holy Spirit given to us in Pentecost will help us enter into the mystery and to the truth of God. The work of the Holy Spirit continues to unfold this mystery in the Sacraments of the Church- in Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Sacred Order, Anointing of the Sick, Reconciliation, and Marriage. Jesus promised in our Gospel that "when the Spirit of truth comes, he will lead you to complete truth" (John 16:13). Mere human mind would not be able to comprehend this truth and we are arrogant if we demand that we should be able to. The Catechism, quoting St Augustine, tells us: "Even when he reveals himself, God remains a mystery beyond words: 'If you understood him, it would not be God'" (CCC 230).

Perhaps the closest experience of God as a Trinity is mirrored in the purity of love. Mother Teresa said "where there is love, there is God." The very nature of the Holy Trinity is a communion of interpersonal love, and he is pouring himself out, making a selfless gift of himself not only at the beginning of creation when he breathed on us his Spirit giving us life but also in God's act of redemption in Jesus Christ who breathed on us again the Holy Spirit to restore us and make us new creation. So then we are called to love like Jesus, embracing our sufferings for the sake of loving God and others. St Paul in the second reading wrote, "these sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us." May this beautiful feast of the Most Holy Trinity bring us closer to God and his truth and proclaim it to others in words and actions as missionary disciples of Jesus.

## CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY  
SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH  
CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

VII. The Acts of the Penitent

**1450** "Penance requires . . . the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart, confess with the lips, and practice complete humility and fruitful satisfaction."<sup>49</sup>

*Contrition*

**1451** Among the penitent's acts contrition occupies first place. Contrition is "sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again."<sup>50</sup>

**1452** When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called "perfect" (contrition of charity). Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible.<sup>51</sup>

**1453** The contrition called "imperfect" (or "attrition") is also a gift of God, a prompting of the Holy Spirit. It is born of the consideration of sin's ugliness or the fear of eternal damnation and the other penalties threatening the sinner (contrition of fear). Such a stirring of conscience can initiate an interior process which, under the prompting of grace, will be brought to completion by sacramental absolution. By itself however, imperfect contrition cannot obtain the forgiveness of grave sins, but it disposes one to obtain forgiveness in the sacrament of Penance.<sup>52</sup>

**1454** The reception of this sacrament ought to be prepared for by an examination of conscience made in the light of the Word of God. The passages best suited to this can be found in the moral catechesis of the Gospels and the apostolic Letters, such as the Sermon on the Mount and the apostolic teachings.<sup>53</sup>




### RCIA PROCESS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults become full, participating members of the Catholic Church. Participants, known as catechumens go through a process of studying the Gospel, nurturing their relationship with God, becoming familiar with the Catholic teachings and practices, professing their faith in Jesus and the Church, and receiving the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If you know anyone who would like to go through the process, and know Jesus Christ more, please contact the parish office on 9622 1125.

### ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on **Saturday 20th August, 9.30am – 2.00pm** at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1- 5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

**The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:**

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. However, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role. **For more information please contact Ged our sacramental coordinator.**

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### When does Children's Liturgy Happen?

The Children's Liturgy of the Word occurs during the mass. At the beginning of mass, the Celebrant calls upon any children who want to participate to come to the front of the church. Then he blesses the children before they move to the prayer space.

### What do the children do?

The leaders and the children will say prayers and listen to the Sunday Gospel at the children's level. The leaders explain the meaning of the Gospel and ask the children questions about the Gospel. The children participate in activities which relate to the Gospel Story.

### When do the children return?

The children return to Mass before the Eucharist celebration begins.

### At what mass is Children's Liturgy available?

The Children's Liturgy takes place every Sunday at the 9.30am mass at St Michael's Church or the 10.00am mass at St Patrick's Church during the school term.

### RAISE THE ROOF APPEAL - NEW ROOF FOR ST. PATRICK'S CHURCH

As of the 9th of June 2022, donations received is **\$27,674.95**. We thank the parishioners who have shared their treasure to our Raise the Roof Appeal. We are praying that more will respond generously to our appeal because it's only through your continued support that we can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Our roof project is composed of the preparation, construction, and completion phase. The St Pat's roof is to be properly rebuilt to provide a safe and lasting haven for all parishioners and visitors. The preparation phase is a bit slow as we faced hurdles in securing the original roof plan of the church. We are working closely with our volunteers who have building, structural and architectural backgrounds to draft repair recommendations, draw new roof plans and prepare project cost estimates, etc. So, at this point, we still have no idea as to what we are facing, with regards to options, costs, and complexities. However, we made the call to kick off our 'Raise the Roof' campaign a few weeks ago, to at least get things started. But, at the same time, we know that, realistically, this is going to involve years of financial support and commitment from us all. We are also in communication with the Diocese and, when more is known, will work with them to determine other funding options, how they might assist us. We will also commit to consulting you, our fellow parishioners, in the meantime, we ask for your generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
