Hospitality and Listening

The Gospel's reading of this Sunday continues from Luke's famous story of the good Samaritan with the same theme of service in love of God and service in love of neighbour.

The Gospel tells us Jesus came to a village where he was welcomed by Martha and Mary. The two sisters welcomed him with open arms but in two different ways. Martha was busy preparing things as a gesture of hospitality that involves serving Jesus to honour him as a guest, while Mary welcomed Jesus by her full attention to the visitor. Mary sits at Jesus' feet and listens to his word. Mary's intention was to make Jesus feel at home and listen to a guest. Martha was not happy, and she raised her concern to Jesus by saying, "Lord do you not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself? Please, tell her to help me." But Jesus says to her, "Martha, Martha, you worry and anxious about so many things, and yet few are needed. Mary has chosen the better part, it is not to be taken from her."

The Gospel's message is twofold: First, we need to understand the Gospel in the light of hospitality, which is one of the works of mercy creating the condition of welcoming, openness, inclusiveness, and respectfulness for all individuals. This is truly our human and Christian virtue, but we feel individualistic to share with our neighbours. We are not positioned to practice hospitality. What about those who are lonely, homeless, marginalised and the sick.

The second part of the message is to listen. Mary has led us perfectly to listen to Jesus. We need to understand that our human love begins at home, and it begins by listening. The more we listen, the more love grows, the more we understand each other. This is the teaching of Jesus Christ. But we are always anxious and worried about many things. We are not in a position to listen to the Word of God. We have become busy with life that we no longer have time to slow down and guietly listen to God, and even to our neighbours. And so, the question is, do we take time to listen to one another and to God?

Therefore, the Gospel calls us to make two different kinds of services to the Kingdom of God, that is, physical serving and contemplative listening. The true story of Martha and Mary makes us to move forward with the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. Amen.

III. The Eucharist in the Economy of Salvation

The signs of bread and wine

1333 At the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood. Faithful to the Lord's command the Church continues to do, in his memory and until his glorious return, what he did on the eve of his Passion: "He took bread...." "He took the cup filled with wine...." the signs of bread and wine become, in a way surpassing understanding, the Body and Blood of Christ; they continue also to signify the goodness of creation. Thus in the Offertory we give thanks to the Creator for bread and wine,¹⁵² fruit of the "work of human hands," but above all as "fruit of the earth" and "of the vine" - gifts of the Creator. the Church sees in the gesture of the king-priest Melchizedek, who "brought out bread and wine," a prefiguring of her own offering.¹⁵³

1334 In the Old Covenant bread and wine were offered in sacrifice among the first fruits of the earth as a sign of grateful acknowledgment to the Creator. But they also received a new significance in the context of the Exodus: the unleavened bread that Israel eats every year at Passover commemorates the haste of the departure that liberated them from Egypt; the remembrance of the manna in the desert will always recall to Israel that it lives by the bread of the Word of God;¹⁵⁴ their daily bread is the fruit of the promised land, the pledge of God's faithfulness to his promises. The "cup of blessing"¹⁵⁵ at the end of the Jewish Passover meal adds to the festive joy of wine an eschatological dimension: the messianic expectation of the rebuilding of Jerusalem. When Jesus instituted the Eucharist, he gave a new and definitive meaning to the blessing of the bread and the cup.

1335 The miracles of the multiplication of the loaves, when the Lord says the blessing, breaks and distributes the loaves through his disciples to feed the multitude, prefigure the superabundance of this unique bread of his Eucharist.¹⁵⁶ The sign of water turned into wine at Cana already announces the Hour of Jesus' glorification. It makes manifest the fulfillment of the wedding feast in the Father's kingdom, where the faithful will drink the new wine that has become the Blood of Christ.¹⁵⁷

1336 The first announcement of the Eucharist divided the disciples, just as the announcement of the Passion scandalized them: "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?"¹⁵⁸ The Eucharist and the Cross are stumbling blocks. It is the same mystery and it never ceases to be an occasion of division. "Will you also go away?":¹⁵⁹ The Lord's question echoes through the ages, as a loving invitation to discover that only he has "the words of eternal life"160 and that to receive in faith the gift of his Eucharist is to receive the Lord himself.

RCIA PROCESS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults become full, participating members of the Catholic Church. Participants, known as catechumens go through a process of studying the Gospel, nurturing their relationship with God, becoming familiar with the Catholic teachings and practices, professing their faith in Jesus and the Church, and receiving the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If you know anyone who would like to go through the process, and know Jesus Christ more, please contact the parish office on 9622 1125, or talk to one of our priests.

ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on **Saturday 20th August, 9.30am – 2.00pm** at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1- 5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. Ho ever, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role. For more information please contact Ged our sacramental coordinator. Date of confirmation will be Thursday 1st September, 2022 at 7.30pm. Please register your interest by Friday 29th July 2022.

As of the 15th of July 2022, donations received is \$34,720.49. We thank the parishioners who have shared their treasure to our Raise the Roof Appeal. Our roof project is composed of the preparation, construction, and completion phase. The St Pat's roof is to be properly rebuilt to provide a safe and lasting haven for all parishioners and visitors. However, we made the call to kick off our 'Raise the Roof' campaign a few weeks ago, to at least get things started. But, at the same time, we know that, realistically, this is going to involve years of financial support and commitment from us all. We are also in communication with the Diocese and, when more is known, will work with them to determine other funding options, how they might assist us. We will also commit to consulting you, our fellow parishioners, in the meantime, we ask for your generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
