#### Dear Parishioners,

In our daily news we witness much violence. Hardly any day passes that we do not hear the sad news of violent aggression and brutality unleashed against innocent people somewhere around the world. To make matters worse, those responsible for these acts of violence often try to justify these cruelties by claiming that they are fighting a holy war in God's name. Let's think of the Crusades, the Middle East, Ireland, Bosnia, and the Taliban. Today's readings are indeed a call to war, not a war against other people but a war against sin, against evil, against the devil.

Scholars tell us that Jesus is speaking here not about the purpose of his coming but about the inevitable consequence of his coming. Jesus came to reveal the true sons and daughters of God who listen to his word, and the children of this world who are opposed to his teaching. This divides all men and women into two camps, the camp of the godly and the camp of the ungodly. There is perpetual conflict, a state of war, between these two groups as one group strives to raise the world up to God and the other to pull it down to hell. These two groups do not exist in two different parts of the world. Rather they live side by side in the same neighbourhood, they live together under the same roof, and in fact the forces of good and evil often exist together in the same person. The holy war to which Christ calls us, therefore, is not a war against people of certain nationalities or cultures, creeds, or ideologies, but a war in which we first must identify the forces for evil in our own persons and in the persons of those who are dear to us (father, son, mother, daughter, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law) and then declare an uncompromising war against these forces.

What are some of these evil forces that we are asked to war against? Well, why don't we start with the Seven Deadly Sins:

Pride: an excessive love of self or the desire to be better or more important than others. Lust: an intense desire, usually for sexual pleasure, but also for money, power, or fame. Gluttony: overconsumption, usually of food or drink. Greed: the desire for and love of possessions. Sloth (or Acedia): physical laziness, also disinterest in spiritual matters or neglecting spiritual growth. Anger or wrath: uncontrolled feelings of hatred or rage. Envy: sadness or desire for the possessions, happiness, talents, or abilities of another.

If we are at war, then we should be prepared for some roughness. The enemy is also fighting against us, and we may have to suffer some harm or hardship. Jesus, our leader in God's holy war did not escape the suffering and death on the cross. But on the third day God raised him to life victorious. God never abandons his people. He will not abandon us if we fight His holy war — the war against evil in ourselves and in the world. Have a lovely and blessed Sunday.

### **RCIA PROCESS**

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults become full, participating members of the Catholic Church. Participants, known as catechumens go through a process of studying the Gospel, nurturing their relationship with God, becoming familiar with the Catholic teachings and practices, professing their faith in Jesus and the Church, and receiving the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If you know anyone who would like to go through the process, and know Jesus Christ more, please contact the parish office on 9622 1125, or talk to one of our priests.

## ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on **Saturday 20th August, 9.30am – 2.00pm** at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1- 5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

### The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. Ho ever, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role. For more information please contact Ged our sacramental coordinator. Date of confirmation will be Thursday 1st September, 2022 at 7.30pm. Please register your interest by Friday 29th July 2022.
