Salvation Offered to All

I remember the time when I had to make one of my most difficult decisions in life, whether I will enter the seminary and become a missionary. From among the many options set before me, I had to take one and be ready to face the consequences of my decision. In retrospect, I found it hard because it would change my life's direction. It was a difficult transition, but it was clear for me that I had to go through the experience to make my life truly meaningful. This insight came through the help of some spiritual persons who journeyed with me in my discernment as to what God really wanted of me to become and to do. For one, I am indebted to the best-selling author M. Scott Peck with his book "The Road Less Travelled." This was very instrumental in putting a period to all my doubts during my discernment. Now, I said, is the time to finally tell my family of my decision even if it meant rejection. And so, it happened...

Things have changed by now, but in the past I had to endure the many trials of family pressure and the purification process in my 10 years of seminary formation. I slowly understand what Scott Peck meant in the book that love is discipline. I put my heart to my vocation and to God who called me but never been spared of many painful events in life...rejected, persecuted in many ways, betrayed, broken. I am always convinced that love is always related with selfmastery, self-control and self-discipline. I learned to become vulnerable and accept that sacrifice and suffering are important elements in growth and maturity, more so in my spiritual journey.

The Letter to the Hebrews (2nd reading- 12:5-7; 11-13) reminded me that I had to endure the trials but saw the hands of God working, and came out victorious. I gradually realized the unfathomable mercy and love of God for me and for others. Indeed, God deserves praise, worship and thanksgiving! Out from the chosen people of God (the Israelites), the Lord "gathers the nations" of every language" to come and see his glory (1st reading- Isaiah 66:18-21).


Everyone has to take a path for himself/herself. We will be lost spiritually if we just drift away. Enlightened and nourished by our faith in Christ, we know that the road, the gate that Jesus asks us to enter is narrow but brings us salvation (Luke 13:22-30). Salvation is being offered to all. God's grace is freely given through Jesus Christ, in his Paschal Mystery (passion, death, resurrection and ascension into heaven), but each one should also be free to accept God's offer. Our response is also as important as the grace given to us by God.

Our Blessed Mother, Mary, Queen of the Family chose the path of true discipleship. She followed Jesus to the foot of the cross. Now she reigns to intercede for all of us her children who turn to her and ask for her prayers. As we celebrate her feast day in our parish community, we may all experience her maternal comfort and help. Happy Feast Day to all!

You can also support the parish by using our **Tap & Go Machine**. The machine is set at \$10, to donate more than \$10 simply tap your credit card as many times as you like. It also accepts Apple Pay, Google Pay and Pay Wave.
