### The Mercy of God

The ultimate reason for the revelation of God's love and mercy is none other than our salvation. If we believe that this is good news then we open the doors of our hearts to be claimed by God constantly as his beloved children and thus experience returning to him every now and then when we are lost. This is basically what conversion of hearts, conversion to God is all about, that we allow ourselves to be embraced by his unconditional love and unfathomable mercy, that we allow God first of all to seek and find us and we decide to belong to him. There is just a very deep mystery of this mercy of God in this Sunday's Liturgy. The Word of God is truly good news and can instruct, educate and form our affections so we may grow in faith especially to the One sent to us, our Lord Jesus Christ.

But, behind this good news, there might seem to be a difficult truth to accept for many of us today...the reality of sin. Our Christian belief informs us that sin exist, yet the much influence of pragmatic and secular psychology to theology, we are beginning to soften too much our concept of sin probably to the point of believing that this is not true and is only a subjective interpretation of the Church's authority back to pre-Vatican II. Relativism has confused us with what is good and bad, what is right and wrong, because with it, we lost the objective basis from the revelation of God. This is even reinforced by the sins of the Church leaders hurting the faith of so many members of the Catholic Church.

I am not sure with the extent of the impact of the penitential rite in our celebration of the Holy Mass when we say "mea culpa, mea culpa, mea maxima culpa..." and strike our chests. Hopefully, we are not so used to it that it does not anymore awaken any sense of meaning in our Liturgy, more so a sense of sorrow for our sins in thought, word, and deed. This is a pastoral reminder: please be present at the beginning of the Holy Mass so we can receive the grace of forgiveness to prepare ourselves to take, though not worthy, the body of Christ.

The whole point of the parables in the gospel is indeed the good news of a God seeking for us, and in finding us celebrates and rejoices. There is a person in the parable of the prodigal son that reminds us of our tendencies today, the elder son who refused to enter the house of the father, who refused to recognize the love of the father. He missed that great opportunity because he does not see himself having sinned. Precisely, the grace and mercy of God cannot work with the righteous people who think they have no wrong, no sins. This is the biggest hindrance to conversion because first of all conversion demands from us letting go, and surrendering to the one who loves us, who seeks us when we are lost. The sacrament of reconciliation that Jesus left for us in the Church offers us the avenue to express our sins, be sorry for them and begin a new life with Christ who saves and gives his life for us! With the new life in Christ, we become sharers and preachers of the good news to others.



### GOSPEL: Lk 15:1-10 (Shorter Form)

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'

# CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Article 3 THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

V. The Sacramental Sacrifice Thanksgiving, Memorial, Presence

The sacrificial memorial of Christ and of his Body, the Church

**1371** The Eucharistic sacrifice is also offered for the faithful departed who "have died in Christ but are not yet wholly purified,"<sup>191</sup> so that they may be able to enter into the light and peace of Christ: Put this body anywhere! Don't trouble yourselves about it! I simply ask you to remember me at the Lord's altar wherever you are.<sup>192</sup> Then, we pray [in the anaphora] for the holy fathers and bishops who have fallen asleep, and in general for all who have fallen asleep before us, in the belief that it is a great benefit to the souls on whose behalf the supplication is offered, while the holy and tremendous Victim is present.... By offering to God our supplications for those who have fallen asleep, if they have sinned, we . . . offer Christ sacrificed for the sins of all, and so render favorable, for them and for us, the God who loves man.<sup>193</sup>

**1372** St. Augustine admirably summed up this doctrine that moves us to an ever more complete participation in our Redeemer's sacrifice which we celebrate in the Eucharist: This wholly redeemed city, the assembly and society of the saints, is offered to God as a universal sacrifice by the high priest who in the form of a slave went so far as to offer himself for us in his Passion, to make us the Body of so great a head.... Such is the sacrifice of Christians: "we who are many are one Body in Christ" the Church continues to reproduce this sacrifice in the sacrament of the altar so well-known to believers wherein it is evident to them that in what she offers she herself is offered.<sup>194</sup>

#### The presence of Christ by the power of his word and the Holy Spirit

**1373** "Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us," is present in many ways to his Church:<sup>195</sup> in his word, in his Church's prayer, "where two or three are gathered in my name,"<sup>196</sup> in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, <sup>197</sup> in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But "he is present . . . most especially in the Eucharistic species."<sup>198</sup>

**1374** The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend."<sup>199</sup> In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained."<sup>200</sup> "This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present."<sup>201</sup>






## st Michael's & St Patrick's Churches
