A Heart Sensitive to the Poor

The face of human poverty is always before us even in the so-called developed countries. It is amazing that even how much people try to eradicate it, this truth always haunts us. Thus, when we open our hearts, we will find deep within us the call for human solidarity and responsibility for each other. The call indeed can elicit a response proper to each person and most of all a response to poverty in whatever form: material, spiritual, even psycho-emotional poverty, the hunger for love and belongingness. It can also draw us to an experience of conversion and transformation from greed and selfishness to generosity and selflessness. Without doubt, everyone shares the same dignity- human dignity, that we are all created in the image and likeness of God. At this level of appreciation of human life, people enter into a relationship where there is respect, concern, and love for Hence, the presence of the poor in our midst reminds us of our connectedness with each other. The poor people are our brothers and sisters, and our gaze towards them awakens our very identity.

It is not surprising that the Holy Scriptures reveal a special attention of God to the poor. The "anawim", the poor of Yahweh are those who have no resources of their own but submit themselves to the will of God. They are lowly in the eyes of the worldly-minded and they exhibit complete trust in God. In Psalm 34, the author recognizes God as the refuge of the poor and the needy, and praises him for the deliverance from trouble. It might be good to look at our hearts once again. Probably we may find that deep within we experience some sort of poverty even not materially. By recognizing it, we begin to acknowledge God as our refuge and grow in our trust and faith in him. It is not surprising why Jesus in his sermon on the mount says, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:3).

Jesus did not only preach it, he lived it from incarnation to his crucifixion. Jesus comes as "anawim." Born in a lowly stable, he has already condescended to become human, and all his life is a manifestation of humility and servanthood. He emptied himself again through his death on the cross. When we are full of ourselves, with our pride and selfreliance then there is no room and space for God. Consequently, we will not be able to see the needs of our brothers and sisters especially the poor. We become insensitive to others.

"My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours." 'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." V. The Sacramental Sacrifice Thanksgiving, Memorial, Presence

The sacrificial memorial of Christ and of his Body, the Church

1379 The tabernacle was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent outside of Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species. It is for this reason that the tabernacle should be located in an especially worthy place in the church and should be constructed in such a way that it emphasizes and manifests the truth of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

1380 It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain present to his Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take his departure from his own in his visible form, he wanted to give us his sacramental presence; since he was about to offer himself on the cross to save us, he wanted us to have the memorial of the love with which he loved us "to the end,"207 even to the giving of his life. In his Eucharistic presence he remains mysteriously in our midst as the one who loved us and gave himself up for us,²⁰⁸ and he remains under signs that express and communicate this love:

The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease. ²⁰⁹




