Persistence in Prayer and persevere in Faith

Last Sunday some of my community members gathered to discuss the effect of COVID-19 on our mental health. The session was facilitated by a youth who felt that it is important to discuss with elders the impact of COVID-19 on individuals, families, and communities. Covid-19 has changed lives: illness, family crisis, loss of jobs, etc. Our lives were put into temptation, which made us to lose our humble heart. Yet we wanted to be there for one another, for our next-door neighbours, and our community members. Above all, we extended our spiritual support, always remained persistent in prayer and persevered in faith, preaching the word of God and returning to God in our needs and thanksgiving, knowing that our help is from the Lord in any circumstance.

This Sunday's Readings speak to us what should we do about injustices. There is always hope, and God will bring justice to the powerless. In the Book of Exodus, Moses prayed during the battle between Joshua and Amalek. The prayer of Moses was not enough, he needed help keeping his arms extended with the support of Aaron and Hur and finally the battle ended with victory against the common enemy. To us, it is sin and death (1 Corinthians 15:26). We cannot do it alone; we need the help of others in our spiritual growth. We pray for one another, unite in sharing our same concerns in our daily struggle. We can always learn from the extended hands of Moses, the symbol of prayer and faith.

In the Gospel, St Luke tells us that the poor widow became weary, but did not give up from injustice of the powerful judge. She persisted until she got justice. What about us, do we get tired asking God for his mercy and forgiveness? Like the widow, we need persistence in asking our God in prayer and persevere in faith. We also need to hear the Words of God to encourage and give us strength, as St Paul tells us in the Second Reading that the Word of God endures forever in good and bad times. Our time is brief and fragile, but the Word of God does not wear out, it remains and does not disappoint.

Therefore, the point for us this Sunday is the power of persistence in prayer, asking God for His mercy and forgiveness. We need to support and pray for one another always without weary. God is always there for us. The life of our Lord Jesus Christ was marked with prayer and preaching. Let us ask the Most Holy Virgin Mary to pray for us as October is the month of the Rosary until our Lord Jesus Christ will find faith in us when spiritual warfare is getting ever more severe. Amen.

VI. The Paschal Banquet

1390 Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite. But "the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly."²²² This is the usual form of receiving communion in the Eastern rites.

The fruits of Holy Communion

1391 Holy Communion augments our union with Christ. the principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Indeed, the Lord said: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me." Live be

On the feasts of the Lord, when the faithful receive the Body of the Son, they proclaim to one another the Good News that the first fruits of life have been given, as when the angel said to Mary Magdalene, "Christ is risen!" Now too are life and resurrection conferred on whoever receives Christ.²²⁵

1392 What material food produces in our bodily life, Holy Communion wonderfully achieves in our spiritual life. Communion with the flesh of the risen Christ, a flesh "given life and giving life through the Holy Spirit," preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism. This growth in Christian life needs the nourishment of Eucharistic Communion, the bread for our pilgrimage until the moment of death, when it will be given to us as viaticum.
