#### **Humbled before God**

Turning to God in prayer is an expression of humility. We acknowledge our dependence on God who is our creator, and we trust in his mercy and love when we truly pray. It reminds us of our creatureliness, our weaknesses and limitations, our sins, and a recognition that we are nothing without God. On the contrary, not praying at all shows our self-reliance, living a life apart from God.

The parable in this Sunday's gospel (Luke 18:9-14) tells us what true prayer is and what is not. Jesus directed his teaching "to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and treated others with contempt." Does the Pharisee who went to the temple to pray really prayed to God? By reading and listening carefully to what he said, it shows that he is not actually talking to God but to himself, exalting who he is and looking down on others especially the ones considered public sinners like the tax collector. This is mere pride and arrogance. This is not prayer at all. Jesus reminds us then of the sin of pride.

True prayer is the prayer of the humble. Humility is the foundation of prayer. Jesus gives us an insight about the prayer of the tax collector who went to the temple standing far off and beating his breast saying, "God, be merciful to me a sinner." He accepted his sins, his own need of God's mercy and grace. Sirach says, in our first reading (Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18), that the prayer of the humble pierces the clouds and is pleasing to the Lord. This is the prayer of the poor in spirit whom Jesus promised the kingdom of heaven in his sermon on the mount, the beatitudes (Matthew 5:3).

The Church teaches us to be humble always at the beginning of the Mass, as we come together to pray and worship the Lord. Let us mean it, when at the penitential rite we strike our breasts as we ask forgiveness from God and turn to his mercy. We stand before God in need of his mercy because after all we are nothing without him. We are taking the posture of humility of a tax collector who after praying in the New Temple through the Church's liturgy we go home justified. Jesus is the greatest model of humility, but the saints are also our examples to emulate. To the saints and to all who humble themselves before God in prayer, Jesus says these words, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." May these words of Jesus encourage us to pray without ceasing and bring us to our knees. God bless us.

VI. The Paschal Banquet

**1393** Holy Communion separates us from sin. the body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins." For this reason the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins:

For as often as we eat this bread and drink the cup, we proclaim the death of the Lord. If we proclaim the Lord's death, we proclaim the forgiveness of sins. If, as often as his blood is poured out, it is poured for the forgiveness of sins, I should always receive it, so that it may always forgive my sins. Because I always sin, I should always have a remedy.<sup>227</sup>

**1394** As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens our charity, which tends to be weakened in daily life; and this living charity wipes away venial sins.<sup>228</sup> By giving himself to us Christ revives our love and enables us to break our disordered attachments to creatures and root ourselves in him:

Since Christ died for us out of love, when we celebrate the memorial of his death at the moment of sacrifice we ask that love may be granted to us by the coming of the Holy Spirit. We humbly pray that in the strength of this love by which Christ willed to die for us, we, by receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, may be able to consider the world as crucified for us, and to be ourselves as crucified to the world.... Having received the gift of love, let us die to sin and live for God.<sup>229</sup>




