Christ's Kingship

This year's liturgical calendar comes to its climax as we are celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King.

When we speak of kings, different images and ideas come to our mind. Kings have power and might, wealth and Lordship over his dominions. Other kings use force to get things done. Of course, one could not imagine of a king without a kingdom.

Our gospel today portrays a completely different kind of a king which in fact does not even deserve a joyful celebration. Jesus, as king, was hanging and nailed to the cross. Apart from the terrible physical pain, Jesus has been stripped of all dignity before a mocking world.

But behold our king: His throne is the cross, His crown is made of thorns, His garment is the blood flowing from the many wounds over His body, His sceptre are the nails that pierced His hands and His only command is "love one another as I have loved you."

Yes, the image of Jesus on the Cross accurately and eloquently captures the true nature of His kingship. In its radicalism, Christ's life embodies the whole vision of God's Kingdom by the way He lived, worked, taught and sacrificed His life in love for us. This is the concept of King and Kingdom that God wants to establish on each and every one of us. A kingdom that is founded in God's love.

Christ as our King has been chosen for us by God, yet it is for each one of us to profess our allegiance to Him and we do this by taking as our own His life and teachings. It should have become imperative for those who believe in Jesus to imitate Him.

Celebrating Christ's kingship should impel us to participate in His mission in order that His reign may be made manifest in our time. In imitation of Him, may we become courageous with His love to share in His Paschal Mystery as the way towards the fullness of His Kingdom. May we accept Jesus Christ as Lord and King to submit to His rule of love so as to become citizens in His Kingdom of righteousness, love and peace.

VII. The Eucharist - "Pledge of the Glory To Come" The Paschal Banquet

IN BRIEF

1406 Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; \dots he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and \dots abides in me, and I in him" (Jn 6:51, 54, 56).

1407 The Eucharist is the heart and the summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ associates his Church and all her members with his sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving offered once for all on the cross to his Father; by this sacrifice he pours out the graces of salvation on his Body which is the Church.

1408 The Eucharistic celebration always includes: the proclamation of the Word of God; thanksgiving to God the Father for all his benefits, above all the gift of his Son; the consecration of bread and wine; and participation in the liturgical banquet by receiving the Lord's body and blood. These elements constitute one single act of worship.

1409 The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover, that is, of the work of salvation accomplished by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, a work made present by the liturgical action.

1410 It is Christ himself, the eternal high priest of the New Covenant who, acting through the ministry of the priests, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. and it is the same Christ, really present under the species of bread and wine, who is the offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice.

1411 Only validly ordained priests can preside at the Eucharist and consecrate the bread and the wine so that they become the Body and Blood of the Lord.

1412 The essential signs of the Eucharistic sacrament are wheat bread and grape wine, on which the blessing of the Holy Spirit is invoked and the priest pronounces the words of consecration spoken by Jesus during the Last Supper: "This is my body which will be given up for you.... This is the cup of my blood...."







EMERGENCY RELIEF FOR THE HORN OF AFRICA

Salesians of Don Bosco Emergency Relief for the Horn of Africa

Recently we have received a request to support emergency relief efforts by the Salesians located in the Horn of Africa. Communities are in need of water, food and hygiene supplies as food shortages increase and conflict continues.

UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT



UPDATE ON ST. MICHAEL'S CHURCH MAINTENANCE WORKS


The Parish Finance Committee, in its recent meeting, decided to release the following updates on the status of the hereunder works to be done on St Michael church:
