This weekend, our parish is privileged to celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving for the priesthood with one of the dioceses most newly ordained priests and a former seminarian who undertook a pastoral placement here in 2017. Fr Jack El Kazzi was ordained at a very joyful celebration last Thursday, 2nd February in our mother Church of St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta with two other deacons by the Most Rev Vincent Long.

Over the last three weeks, we have been navigating Christ's famous Sermon on the Mount, as recorded by the Evangelist, St Matthew. It is in this sermon, as our 4th Century Church Father, St Augustine, says, we will find "the highest morals [and] a perfect standard for Christian life". Christ's sermon presents to us a new programme of life and the features of the New Covenant, to be consummated by His blood sacrificed on Good Friday.

This Sunday's excerpt is commonly referred to as the "Antitheses", due to Christ's repeated phraseology: "you have heard that it was said...but I say to you", a formula for the new Torah and the "law of Christ" (Gal 5:13). Although Christ is often misrepresented as a liberator from the harsh Mosaic Law, this new Moses who is the "fulfilment of the Law and the prophets" rather immerses us more deeply into the formative spirit of the law, and if anything introduces a far more demanding rule of life, which ultimately compels the disciple to 'renounce himself and take up his cross' (Mt 16:24). The paradoxes of the Beatitudes and the imperatives of the Antitheses instils the discordance between worldly wisdom and godly wisdom, establishing a life of subject to hostility, though promising newfound freedom and fulfilment, perfectly witnessed through the life of Christ and our glorious martyrs.

Last Thursday, as the Church sung her intercessory litany, the soon-to-be Fr El Kazzi lay prostrate, with his arms laid out in a cruciform posture of humility and sacrifice, symbolising his newfound vocational freedom in laying down his life for you: the Church. Despite the seeming absurdity in pursuing a priestly vocation within the current climate of our culture and Church. Fr El Kazzi is a testament to how the scandal of the Gospel can radically enhance our lives. After living a self-described "misquided youth" he was coaxed into attending WYD '08 wherein his devotion to our Lord and Blessed Mother and participation in the life of the Church enriched his own to such an extent that he uncovered a God-given desire to exercise this exclusively. Fr El Kazzi, now being configured to Christ the Priest, embarks on a life as a walking antithesis to the world. Each time he utters the words "this is my body, this is my blood, given up for you", he will confront the crux of his mission, that it is not by professing his many admirable qualities and abilities, but only in dying to himself and daily rising in Christ.

Our Lady, Mother of Priests, pray for him.



V. The Many Forms of Penance in Christian Life

1439 The process of conversion and repentance was described by Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, the center of which is the merciful father:³⁷ The fascination of illusory freedom, the abandonment of the father's house; the extreme misery in which the son finds himself after squandering his fortune; his deep humiliation at finding himself obliged to feed swine, and still worse, at wanting to feed on the husks the pigs ate; his reflection on all he has lost; his repentance and decision to declare himself guilty before his father; the journey back; the father's generous welcome; the father's joy - all these are characteristic of the process of conversion. the beautiful robe, the ring, and the festive banquet are symbols of that new life - pure worthy, and joyful - of anyone who returns to God and to the bosom of his family, which is the Church. Only the heart of Christ Who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a way.

VI. The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

1440 Sin is before all else an offense against God, a rupture of communion with him. At the same time it damages communion with the Church. For this reason conversion entails both God's forgiveness and reconciliation with the Church, which are expressed and accomplished liturgically by the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.³⁸

Only God forgives sin

1441 Only God forgives sins.³⁹ Since he is the Son of God, Jesus says of himself, "The Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" and exercises this divine power: "Your sins are forgiven."⁴⁰ Further, by virtue of his divine authority he gives this power to men to exercise in his name.⁴¹

1442 Christ has willed that in her prayer and life and action his whole Church should be the sign and instrument of the forgiveness and reconciliation that he acquired for us at the price of his blood. But he entrusted the exercise of the power of absolution to the apostolic ministry which he charged with the "ministry of reconciliation." The apostle is sent out "on behalf of Christ" with "God making his appeal" through him and pleading: "Be reconciled to God."





RAISE THE ROOF APPEAL - NEW ROOF FOR ST. PATRICK'S CHURCH

UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT

We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who shared their treasures to our church. As of 3rd February 2023, we have received the sum of \$68,154.90 in donations. We are also thankful to those who are still considering... only your continued support can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Where are we now? The parish maintenance volunteers in their recent meeting decided to contact the Property Manager of the Diocese of Parramatta to provide a roof expert to reassess the roof issue and provide recommendations. The Property Manager of the Diocese has advised the parish office that a Roof Auditor will be engaged towards the end of February to conduct an audit of the condition of St Patrick's Church roof and present findings to the Finance Committee, which could help to form the basis of the solution of the roof issue. We will keep you posted of the outcome. Again we ask for your patience, generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
