Our readings for this Sunday are very encouraging. Christ tells us to let our light shine. The grace he offers us, the conversion he wants for us, his will for us in every moment, is never a matter of stifling us, of detracting from who we really are, but is always the gift he offers to enable us to be that which we were always meant to

God doesn't produce robots, there's no such thing as a cooky-cutter Christian. Each of us is unique and is meant to reflect his glory, his goodness in a particular way. But we cannot do it without his grace, without his help, without living in that union with him by which we can truly say that the light that I shine out into the world is truly mine and truly his.

St Catherine of Siena is famous for saying, "be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire." Catherine wouldn't have wanted us to despair of the seemingly meagre difference we might be able to make in the world if we compared our contribution with her impressive resume. We aren't all Catherine, and our "setting the world on fire" will look different in every case. We probably won't reprimand popes or have mystical dialogues with the Father. Our influence will be different, but never the worse because of that, quite to the contrary.

But if we are to fulfil the unique purpose God has for each of us, two things are required. The first is that we need to pray. Without listening to him in that attitude of lowly simplicity with which the Blessed Virgin approached him, we won't have him and the sure guidance he provides every day. The second is related. We need to grow in self-knowledge. Unless we really know who we are and can grow in a holy acceptance of ourselves, every endeavour to be good and to affect the world will be based on a false idea of ourselves and our efforts will be in vain. Make your times of prayer a place where you can wrestle with God and be challenged by him to learn and to grow so that he can enter into the darkness of our hearts and transform them into light. Only then will our light shine out for others so that their light may in turn be seen as well.

THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

V. The Many Forms of Penance in Christian Life

1434 The interior penance of the Christian can be expressed in many and various ways. Scripture and the Fathers insist above all on three forms, fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, higher express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others. Alongside the radical purification brought about by Baptism or martyrdom they cite as means of obtaining forgiveness of sins: effort at reconciliation with one's neighbor, tears of repentance, concern for the salvation of one's neighbor, the intercession of the saints, and the practice of charity "which covers a multitude of sins."

1435 Conversion is accomplished in daily life by gestures of reconciliation, concern for the poor, the exercise and defense of justice and right,³³ by the admission of faults to one's brethren, fraternal correction, revision of life, examination of conscience, spiritual direction, acceptance of suffering, endurance of persecution for the sake of righteousness. Taking up one's cross each day and following Jesus is the surest way of penance.³⁴

1436 Eucharist and Penance. Daily conversion and penance find their source and nourishment in the Eucharist, for in it is made present the sacrifice of Christ which has reconciled us with God. Through the Eucharist those who live from the life of Christ are fed and strengthened. "It is a remedy to free us from our daily faults and to preserve us from mortal sins." ³⁵

1437 Reading Sacred Scripture, praying the Liturgy of the Hours and the Our Father - every sincere act of worship or devotion revives the spirit of conversion and repentance within us and contributes to the forgiveness of our sins.

1438 The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice.36 These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works).

MINISTRY FORMATION


The parish Ministry Team invites those currently involved, or those wishing to be involved in liturgical ministry to attend our Ministry Formation Courses starting from the 4th February.





UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT


We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who shared their treasures to our church. As of 3rd February 2023, we have received the sum of \$68,154.90 in donations. We are also thankful to those who are still considering... only your continued support can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Where are we now? The parish maintenance volunteers in their recent meeting decided to contact the Property Manager of the Diocese of Parramatta to provide a roof expert to reassess the roof issue and provide recommendations. The Property Manager of the Diocese has advised the parish office that a Roof Auditor will be engaged towards the end of February to conduct an audit of the condition of St Patrick's Church roof and present findings to the Finance Committee, which could help to form the basis of the solution of the roof issue. We will keep you posted of the outcome. Again we ask for your patience, generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.


