Over the last few weeks, I have made brief reference to the organisation of the Church's Lectionary (i.e. the selection of readings) during the Lenten Season. Throughout the three-year lectionary cycle in Ordinary Time, we more-or-less navigate Christ's public ministry systematically, going through each of the first three Gospels (the so-called 'Synoptic Gospels'). as well as systematically going through the Pauline Letters. In Lent, as well as in the other seasons, the Church is very deliberate in her selection of readings and prayers, and as our Mother, tries to nurture, direct and illume our pathway during this Lenten retreat. Of highest concern, most especially for our current liturgical year (Yr A), is those in the Order of Catechumens, who already enjoy the motherly love of the Church as they prepare to be initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil, entering the womb of the Church in the baptismal font and being born into new life through this "fountain of living water". Thus, over the next few weeks on our Sundays in Lent, the parish will have the privilege of participating and witnessing our wonderful catechumens undergo the three scrutinies, wherein 'all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect are to be uncovered, and to strengthen all that is upright, strong and good'- a very comforting reminder of what we should all be repeating and modelling for our little brothers and sisters in this holy season.

Thus, we will see our readings provide somewhat of a "highlights reel" of our salvation history, a fervent reminder for us long-time Catholics and an apt catechetical programme for our Catechumens. Our Old Testament first readings are no longer selected to be hinged directly on the Gospel reading (as in Ordinary Time) but demonstrates a summary of God's saving actions throughout history, anticipating our ultimate redemption through the passion and death of our Lord. In these last few weeks, for example, we have meditated on the fall of mankind, the covenant with Abraham, and this week the great Exodus. This will culminate in our most ancient, glorious and solemn Easter Vigil Liturgy, which through its seven Old Testament readings and psalms will see Christ's one saving act echoed throughout our history.

The Sunday Gospel readings fittingly begin with Christ's temptation in the desert, setting the scene for our Lenten retreat and will always be followed with a reading of the Transfiguration, both directing us to Jerusalem and providing some solace and hope as we approach the scandalous scene of the Cross. Following this, we will meditate on some major events from the Gospel of John, which does not have a dedicated year in the lectionary cycle. Year A, purposefully designed for our Catechumens, will highlight some major miraculous signs given by Christ, with a particular spiritual focus on the effects of initiation into the Body of Christ, through this Sunday's account of the Samaritan Woman at the well and the Living Water discourse, the man born blind who is healed both physically and spiritually, and the raising of Lazarus from the dead.

So let us not only support our Catechumens through prayer, but let us truly enter with them this journey through Lent and be inspired by their young faith.

## THE LITURGY THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR A

#### ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Ps 24:15-16

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

FIRST READING: EX 17:3-7

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 94:1-2. 6-9. R. V.8

(R.) If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Jn 4:42. 15

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! Lord, you are truly the Saviour of the world; give me living water, that I may never thirst again. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

#### GOSPEL: Jn 4:5-15. 19-26. 39-42 (Shorter Form)

Jesus came to the Samaritan town called Sychar, near the land that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Jacob's well is there and Jesus, tired by the journey, sat straight down by the well. It was about the sixth hour. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink.' His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, 'What? You are a Jew and you ask me, a Samaritan, for a drink?' – Jews, in fact, do not associate with Samaritans.

Jesus replied: 'If you only knew what God is offering and who it is that is saying to you: Give me a drink, you would have been the one to ask, and he would have given you living water.'

You have no bucket, sir,' she answered 'and the well is deep: how could you get this living water?

Are you a greater man than our father Jacob who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his sons and his cattle?'

Jesus replied: 'Whoever drinks this water will get thirsty again: but anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again: the water that I shall give will turn into a spring inside him, welling up to eternal life.'

'Sir,' said the woman, 'give me some of that water, so that I may never get thirsty and never have to come here again to draw water. I see you are a prophet, sir. Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, while you say that Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship.'

Jesus said: 'Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know; for salvation comes from the Jews.

But the hour will come — in fact it is here already — when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth: that is the kind of worshipper the Father wants. God is spirit, and those who worship must worship in spirit and truth.'

The woman said to him, 'I know that Messiah – that is, Christ – is coming; and when he comes he will tell us everything.' 'I who am speaking to you,' said Jesus 'I am he.'

Many Samaritans of that town had believed in him on the strength of the woman's testimony, so, when the Samaritans came up to him, they begged him to stay with them. He stayed for two days, and when he spoke to them many more came to believe; and they said to the woman, 'Now we no longer believe because of what you told us; we have heard him ourselves and we know that he really is the saviour of the world.'

VII. The Acts of the Penitent

1454 The reception of this sacrament ought to be prepared for by an examination of conscience made in the light of the Word of God. the passages best suited to this can be found in the moral catechesis of the Gospels and the apostolic Letters, such as the Sermon on the Mount and the apostolic teachings.

The confession of sins

**1455** The confession (or disclosure) of sins, even from a simply human point of view, frees us and facilitates our reconciliation with others. Through such an admission man looks squarely at the sins he is guilty of, takes responsibility for them, and thereby opens himself again to God and to the communion of the Church in order to make a new future possible.



## RAISE THE ROOF APPEAL - NEW ROOF FOR ST. PATRICK'S CHURCH

#### **UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT**

We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who shared their treasures to our church. As of 6th March 2023, we have received the sum of \$70,367.90 in donations. We are also thankful to those who are still considering... only your continued support can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Where are we now? The parish maintenance volunteers in their recent meeting decided to contact the Property Manager of the Diocese of Parramatta to provide a roof expert to reassess the roof issue and provide recommendations. The Property Manager of the Diocese has advised the parish office that a Roof Auditor will be engaged towards the end of February to conduct an audit of the condition of St Patrick's Church roof and present findings to the Finance Committee, which could help to form the basis of the solution of the roof issue. We will keep you posted of the outcome. Again we ask for your patience, generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
