Truly, Now I can see Light!

Again, the Gospel of this Fourth Sunday of Lent presents us with a long and very detailed Gospel of John about the man born blind all his life. Jesus made a paste, put it on his eyes, asked him to go and wash in the Pool of Siloam. The man had shown courage to do that and when he washed and came back his sight was fully restored.

In this Gospel's story, groups of people investigated the healing of the man born blind, who truly can see light. The Gospel tells us that the neighbours were first to investigate their closest friend, who associated with them. They were hesitant, but they came to their senses to believe that it was the man who was blind, but now could see. Then the Pharisees took the responsibility over, who were the guardians of faith. The Pharisees did not make honest attempt to find out what really happened to this man born blind. They said, "This man cannot be of God, he cured you on Sabbath, this cannot be what it would seem to be." It is not allowed and wrong. They were openly hostile to anything to be said about Christ. The blind man stood up to the powerful Pharisees, defending his faith and kingship of Jesus. He took the risk of being thrown out from the synagogue.

Then, the Pharisees brought pressure to the parents of the man born blind. They asked the parents, "Is this your son? Yes. Was he blind? Yes. How is it that he can now see? We don't know. If you want to know, ask him. He is old enough. He can tell you the truth". The parents were scared that they would be expelled. The Pharisees failed to accept the truth about the work of God in Jesus, who is Christ, the light of the world.

As Christians, the message is to us. We are all born blind, we are spiritually blind, we are sinners. Why? Because we do not see Jesus, the light of the world, what is right, good, and true is now hidden from our view. We still need to open our eyes and hearts to make space for the source of light, and healer of physical and spiritual blindness. We need Jesus Christ to heal and restore us to the light.

How do we find truth, the light of Jesus? By our faith, by seeking Jesus and loving him. The blind man found Jesus. He praved to find Jesus. He got gift of spiritual sight, faith, and physical light. He became the disciple of Jesus. The pharisees were not seeking truth, light of Jesus, they were blinded. They were covered with darkness. May we not allow Satan and evil of this world to blind us and not to forget our real identity and call. Amen.





Gospel (Cont.)

THE LITURGY FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Is 66:10-11

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

FIRST READING: 1 SM 16:1. 6-7. 10-13

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 22 R. V.1

(R.) The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

SECOND READING: EPH 5:8-14

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Jn 8:12

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! I am the light of the world, says the Lord; whoever follows me will have the light of life. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL: Jn 9:1-41

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. His disciples asked him, 'Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, for him to have been born blind?' 'Neither he nor his parents sinned,' Jesus answered, 'he was born blind so that the works of God might be displayed in him. 'As long as the day lasts I must carry out the work of the one who sent me; the night will soon be here when no one can work. As long as I am in the world I am the light of the world.'

Having said this, he spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored.

His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.' So they said to him, 'Then how do your eyes come to be open?' 'The man called Jesus' he answered 'made a paste, daubed my eyes with it and said to me, "Go and wash at Siloam"; so I went, and when I washed I could see.' They asked, 'Where is he?' 'I don't know' he answered.

They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man.

However, the Jews would not believe that the man had been blind and had gained his sight, without first sending for his parents and asking them, 'Is this man really your son who you say was born blind? If so, how is it that he is now able to see?' His parents answered, 'We know he is our son and we know he was born blind, but we don't know how it is that he can see now, or who opened his eyes. He is old enough: let him speak for himself.' His parents spoke like this out of fear of the Jews, who had already agreed to expel from the synagogue anyone who should acknowledge Jesus as the Christ. This was why his parents said, 'He is old enough; ask him.'

So the Jews again sent for the man and said to him, 'Give glory to God! For our part, we know that this man is a sinner.' The man answered, 'I don't know if he is a sinner; I only know that I was blind and now I can see.' They said to him, 'What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?' He replied, 'I have told you once and you wouldn't listen. Why do you want to hear it all again? Do you want to become his disciples too?' At this they hurled abuse at him: 'You can be his disciple,' they said 'we are disciples of Moses: we know that God spoke to Moses, but as for this man, we don't know where he comes from.' The man replied, 'Now here is an astonishing thing! He has opened my eyes, and you don't know where he comes from! We know that God doesn't listen to sinners, but God does listen to men who are devout and do his will. Ever since the world began it is unheard of for anyone to open the eyes of a man who was born blind; if this man were not from God, he couldn't do a thing.' 'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away.

Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him. Jesus said: 'It is for judgement that I have come into this world, so that those without sight may see and those with sight turn blind.'

Hearing this, some Pharisees who were present said to him, 'We are not blind, surely?' Jesus replied:

'Blind? If you were, you would not be guilty, but since you say, "We see", your guilt remains.'

UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT

We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who shared their treasures to our church. As of 6th March 2023, we have received the sum of \$70,452.90 in donations. We are also thankful to those who are still considering... only your continued support can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Where are we now? The parish maintenance volunteers in their recent meeting decided to contact the Property Manager of the Diocese of Parramatta to provide a roof expert to reassess the roof issue and provide recommendations. The Property Manager of the Diocese has advised the parish office that a Roof Auditor will be engaged towards the end of February to conduct an audit of the condition of St Patrick's Church roof and present findings to the Finance Committee, which could help to form the basis of the solution of the roof issue. We will keep you posted of the outcome. Again we ask for your patience, generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
