In many of the times of suffering and trial in our lives, we find it very hard to trust in God. We ask him to look after us and those we love but it is guite often halfheartedly. We are quite often suspicious of God.

Our first reading this week reminds us of the centrality of the virtue of faith. In the scriptures, faith isn't principally about the ideas or events I intellectually assent to. Rather, faith is about trust. It's about the attitude we have in our relationship with God. Faith means trusting in who God is, and thus in what he tells me, in what he asks of me, and our faith is most severely tested when we have no reason to trust other than because he said so. This makes it very hard to trust in God, because we want to be secure, we want to know that everything is going to be ok. Everything will be ok, just not always in the way we imagine. Abram was able to do as the Lord had told him, because he trusted in the fidelity of God, that he is good and is a Father who keeps his promises, not because he could see how the outrageous promises God makes him could possibly come true.

We have even more reason to believe, to persevere in prayer and in our trust of God because of Jesus. Jesus told his disciples he was going to die but rise again, and he wanted to give them some assurance by taking them up the mountain and revealing to them his glory. You can believe in me, he says, because I have shown you who I am and from whom I come, there is no reason to doubt me. This must have been part of what made John the Beloved stick by him all the way to Calvary. We are fortunate enough to have even more than the Transfiguration to rely on. Our trust in God rests primarily on Jesus' death and Resurrection. It is this event which more than anything manifests to us the providence of God – that no matter what happens in our life, he will work all things for our good, and the good of those we love. Even the worst that can happen, a gruesome and cruel death, can be overcome by the power of his love for us.

So let us persevere in our prayer. Let us trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us in our petitions for ourselves and for one another, and that at the heart of each prayer will be this filial trust in him and in his plan.



PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING Article 4 THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

VI. The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation Reconciliation with the Church

1449 The formula of absolution used in the Latin Church expresses the essential elements of this sacrament; the Father of mercies is the source of all forgiveness. He effects the reconciliation of sinners through the Passover of his Son and the gift of his Spirit, through the prayer and ministry of the Church:

God, the Father of mercies, through the death and the resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holv Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

VII. The Acts of the Penitent

1450 "Penance requires . . . the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart, confess with the lips, and practice complete humility and fruitful satisfaction. Contrition

1451 Among the penitent's acts contrition occupies first place. Contrition is "sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again.

1452 When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called "perfect" (contrition of charity). Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible.

1453 The contrition called "imperfect" (or "attrition") is also a gift of God, a prompting of the Holy Spirit. It is born of the consideration of sin's ugliness or the fear of eternal damnation and the other penalties threatening the sinner (contrition of fear). Such a stirring of conscience can initiate an interior process which, under the prompting of grace, will be brought to completion by sacramental absolution. By itself however, imperfect contrition cannot obtain the forgiveness of grave sins, but it disposes one to obtain forgiveness in the sacrament of Penance.

UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT

We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who shared their treasures to our church. As of 3rd February 2023, we have received the sum of \$68,154.90 in donations. We are also thankful to those who are still considering... only your continued support can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Where are we now? The parish maintenance volunteers in their recent meeting decided to contact the Property Manager of the Diocese of Parramatta to provide a roof expert to reassess the roof issue and provide recommendations. The Property Manager of the Diocese has advised the parish office that a Roof Auditor will be engaged towards the end of February to conduct an audit of the condition of St Patrick's Church roof and present findings to the Finance Committee, which could help to form the basis of the solution of the roof issue. We will keep you posted of the outcome. Again we ask for your patience, generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
