Moving Forward With Jesus

strives to live as a faithful and committed This Sunday's Gospel is the journey narrative about the famous "Road to Emmaus." The two disciples afterwards realized that while listening to Jesus their hearts were lifted up and in the breaking of the bread they recognized Jesus' presence throughout their journey.

> The Risen Christ assures that His appearances manifest His desire to bring peace, to dissolve the fears and uncertainties accumulated during the days of passion and death. His appearance in their midst bespeaks how real He is. The Gospel echoes everything what has been foretold by the law and the prophets that He is the one to bring deliverance from any form of evil.

> When fear is taking shape before us as the only reality possible, we must look at the Resurrection of Jesus assuming a relevance to our own pains and sufferings that may regain our peace of mind and calm down worries and disappointments. There may be three faith assurances that we can have as we contemplate on the resurrection:

> Firstly, Christ is present in His Word. The two disciples' experience may make us understand the importance of the scriptures. Listening to Jesus makes our heart become a flaming heart, a heart that endures and perseveres.

> Secondly, Christ's real presence in the eucharist. It was in the breaking of the bread, in dining with His disciple, Jesus was truly recognized. Christ is present in the eucharist, not merely symbolically or metaphorically, but in a true, real and substantial way. The presence of each other at table in the family is an affirmation of Christ's presence.

> Lastly, Christ's presence in repentance and reconciliation. The first reading in the Acts of the Apostles contains the disciples' witnesses to the Risen Christ. Acknowledging the power of the resurrection, they continued His works, admonishing with gospel message to amend lives so that God's healing and peace may come through the forgiveness of sins.

> Easter may mean moving forward, adhering to the Word of God, sharing at the table of His love and coming together reconciling and forgiving. Darkness will turn into light and peace may come in our midst.



THE LITURGY THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER ~ YEAR A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Ps 65:1-2

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

FIRST READING: ACTS 2:14, 22-33

(R.) Lord, you will show us the path of life.

SECOND READING: 1 PT 1:17-21

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: See Lk 24:32

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, make your word plain to us: make our hearts burn with love when you speak. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Lk 24:13-35

Two of the disciples of Jesus were on their way to a village called Emmaus, seven miles from Jerusalem, and they were talking together about all that had happened. Now as they talked this over, Jesus himself came up and walked by their side; but something prevented them from recognising him. He said to them, 'What matters are you discussing as you walk along?' They stopped short, their faces downcast.

Then one of them, called Cleopas, answered him, 'You must be the only person staying in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have been happening there these last few days.' 'What things?' he asked. 'All about Jesus of Nazareth' they answered 'who proved he was a great prophet by the things he said and did in the sight of God and of the whole people; and how our chief priests and our leaders handed him over to be sentenced to death, and had him crucified. Our own hope had been that he would be the one to set Israel free. And this is not all: two whole days have gone by since it all happened; and some women from our group have astounded us: they went to the tomb in the early morning, and when they did not find the body, they came back to tell us they had seen a vision of angels who declared he was alive. Some of our friends went to the tomb and found everything exactly as the women had reported, but of him they saw nothing.'

Then he said to them, 'You foolish men! So slow to believe the full message of the prophets! Was it not ordained that the Christ should suffer and so enter into his glory?' Then, starting with Moses and going through all the prophets, he explained to them the passages throughout the scriptures that were about himself.

When they drew near to the village to which they were going, he made as if to go on; but they pressed him to stay with them. 'It is nearly evening' they said 'and the day is almost over.' So he went in to stay with them. Now while he was with them at table, he took the bread and said the blessing; then he broke it and handed it to them. And their eyes were opened and they recognised him; but he had vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, 'Did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road and explained the scriptures to us?'

They set out that instant and returned to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven assembled together with their companions, who said to them, 'Yes, it is true. The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon.' Then they told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised him at the breaking of bread.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Lk 24:35

THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

VIII. The Minister of This Sacrament

1461 Since Christ entrusted to his apostles the ministry of reconciliation, ⁶⁵ bishops who are their successors, and priests, the bishops' collaborators, continue to exercise this ministry. Indeed bishops and priests, by virtue of the sacrament of Holy Orders, have the power to forgive all sins "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

1462 Forgiveness of sins brings reconciliation with God, but also with the Church. Since ancient times the bishop, visible head of a particular Church, has thus rightfully been considered to be the one who principally has the power and ministry of reconciliation: he is the moderator of the penitential discipline.⁶⁶ Priests, his collaborators, exercise it to the extent that they have received the commission either from their bishop (or religious superior) or the Pope, according to the law of the Church.⁶⁷

1463 Certain particularly grave sins incur excommunication, the most severe ecclesiastical penalty, which impedes the reception of the sacraments and the exercise of certain ecclesiastical acts, and for which absolution consequently cannot be granted, according to canon law, except by the Pope, the bishop of the place or priests authorized by them.⁶⁸ In danger of death any priest, even if deprived of faculties for hearing confessions, can absolve from every sin and excommunication.⁶⁹

A Synod is an event where clergy, religious, and the laity gather to discuss important matters relating to the life and mission of the Church.





Father Chris Alar, MIC, entered the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception, the religious community entrusted with spreading the message and devotion of Divine Mercy, as a postulant in July 2006. Prior to that time, he received a Bachelor of Science in industrial engineering and a Masters of Business Administration (MBA) from the University of Michigan.

After working as an engineering manager at a large automotive supplier in Detroit, he began his own consulting firm in Charlotte, North Carolina, in 2000. Answering the Lord's call, he attended Franciscan University of Steubenville, in Ohio, for his philosophy studies; Dominican House of Studies in Washington, D.C., for his theology studies; and he earned his Masters of Divinity degree from Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut. He wrote and produced the popular "Divine Mercy 101" and "Explaining the Faith" DVD series and is the author of the bestselling book After Suicide: There's Hope for Them and for You, as well as Understanding Divine Mercy. He is host of the EWTN show Living Divine Mercy, which airs on Wednesdays, 6:30 p.m. EST. He serves as "Fr. Joseph, MIC," the Director of the Association of Marian Helpers, and is the head of Marian Press, located on the grounds of the National Shrine of The Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts.
