Jesus, the Good Shepherd: a call for Vocation

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday, also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We are invited to pray for vocations of priesthood, diaconate, the consecrated life, and lay vocation in the Church.

We hear the readings of the Old and New Testaments use the image of the Shepherd and flock to tell us the unique relationship of God with Israel, and of Christ with Christians. In the Gospel, Jesus described two brief parables. The first parable describes Jesus as the selfless servant, the good shepherd sent by God to care for the people of Israel who had been abandoned by their appointed leaders for so long. The second parable describes Jesus as a unique gateway or sheep gate guiding his flock to eternal salvation. Jesus is the gate to let us access God.

In the First reading, if we can read closely, St Peter gave his first sermon during the day of Pentecost. He was telling his fellow Jewish listeners that they have crucified their true shepherd. But he rose from the dead. He asked his listeners to repent and receive forgiveness for their sin by receiving baptism in the name of Jesus. They should acknowledge Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. In the second reading, Peter did not leave there, he encourages the suffering Christians to become fully the children of God by following in the footsteps of their suffering Servant, the Good Shepherd who protects his sheep from the wolf.

Jesus did not come to steal or destroy as a hired shepherd, but he has come to fill us with his self-giving words of his own divine life. We know that the hired shepherds expose the sheep to danger rather than caring for them. We are sadly aware of how the Church has suffered from mere hired shepherds who exploited and abused the sheep. This is the time for us to think deeper into our vocation. Because Jesus knows his sheep and they are eager to listen and recognise his voice, that is, his teaching. He gives them eternal life not to be taken out from his

In today's readings, Jesus calls us to be good shepherds of God's flock and good sheep of his Church in the parishes where we find ourselves living. Jesus says to us, he is the Good Shepherd and that his sheep follow him because they recognise his voice. But why should we follow Jesus? Because through the water of baptism we are filled with the Holy Spirit. We are called to follow, listen, obey, and to do what he asks us to do to continue in his mission until the end of the world.

As Christians, we are called to take vocation through our baptism. The baptised Christians are to take and carry the cross of Jesus as a ransom for h<mark>uman suffering, our Christian vocation cannot</mark> be on what we do, but by our sacrifice and the love that Jesus Christ has shown us. Let us remember as we reflect on the readings for this fourth Sunday of Easter.

THE LITURGY FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ~ YEAR A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Ps 32:5-6

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

FIRST READING: ACTS 2:14. 36-41

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 22:1-6. R. V.1

(R.) The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

SECOND READING: 1 PT 2:20-25

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Jn 10:14

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Jn 10:1-10

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold.

All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate.

Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy.

I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

Article 4 THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION

THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

VIII. The Minister of This Sacrament

1464 Priests must encourage the faithful to come to the sacrament of Penance and must make themselves available to celebrate this sacrament each time Christians reasonably ask for it.⁷⁰

1465 When he celebrates the sacrament of Penance, the priest is fulfilling the ministry of the Good Shepherd who seeks the lost sheep, of the Good Samaritan who binds up wounds, of the Father who awaits the prodigal son and welcomes him on his return, and of the just and impartial judge whose judgment is both just and merciful. the priest is the sign and the instrument of God's merciful love for the sinner.

1466 The confessor is not the master of God's forgiveness, but its servant. the minister of this sacrament should unite himself to the intention and charity of Christ.⁷¹ He should have a proven knowledge of Christian behavior, experience of human affairs, respect and sensitivity toward the one who has fallen; he must love the truth, be faithful to the Magisterium of the Church, and lead the penitent with patience toward healing and full maturity. He must pray and do penance for his penitent, entrusting him to the Lord's mercy.

1467 Given the delicacy and greatness of this ministry and the respect due to persons, the Church declares that every priest who hears confessions is bound under very severe penalties to keep absolute secrecy regarding the sins that his penitents have confessed to him. He can make no use of knowledge that confession gives him about penitents' lives.⁷² This secret, which admits of no exceptions, is called the "sacramental seal," because what the penitent has made known to the priest remains "sealed" by the sacrament.





This will be hosted for about 25 minutes during the 9.30am


Sunday Mass at St. Michael's and the 10.00am Sunday mass at St. Patrick's.

He wrote and produced the popular "Divine Mercy 101" and "Explaining the Faith" DVD series and is the author of the bestselling book After Suicide: There's Hope for Them and for You, as well as Understanding Divine Mercy. He is host of the EWTN show Living Divine Mercy, which airs on Wednesdays, 6:30 p.m. EST. He serves as "Fr. Joseph, MIC," the Director of the Association of Marian Helpers, and is the head of Marian Press, located on the grounds of the National Shrine of The Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts.

AN EVENING WITH SIMON CARRINGTON



I am also looking forward to visiting a number of towns/cities across Europe where saints have devoted their lives to Christ, and where miracles have taken place. I imagine that being physically present in these Holy sites will only strengthen my faith.

On returning from the pilgrimage, I hope to be able to share my experiences and what I have learnt with those in the parish community. I believe myself and the other pilgrims from our parish will be devoted to establishing a strong faith-based culture within the youth of our parish which is vital for the future of our Church.


