The Risen Lord is our hope

Happy Easter! Christ risen from the dead gives us hope. This hope is born as we place our faith in God who is victorious over evil, sin, suffering and death. St Paul reminds us "to be content to hope that we shall be saved" (Romans 8:24). The foundation of our hope is God. It is He who created us out of love, has redeemed us in love through his Beloved Son, and will save us out of his love. This is the ultimate reason of our faith and our hope, and whatever we face at this timeour challenges, fears, the crosses we carry will find its glory in the Risen Lord.

Our Gospel tells us of the "other disciple, the one Jesus loved" known to be John, who saw on the "first day of the week" the tomb that was empty, and he believed. John represents every faithful disciple of Jesus, who follows him to Calvary and through the eyes of faith see the living Jesus present in our midst. Faith in the Risen Lord has sustained his disciples throughout the generations to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to all the corners of the world. It has become the source of strength of every believer in the midst of persecutions. The risen Christ has shown us what we would be in the future as we place our faith in him. Writing to the Corinthians, St Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised then our preaching is useless and your believing it is useless" (1 Corinthians 15:14).

Let us receive the Good News then in faith and trust in God. By its reception, however, we are called to set our hearts to heaven. The second reading invites us. "Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on the heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth" (Colossians 3:1-2). The works of charity- of helping the poor and the needy, of loving one another, are indeed grounded on our vocation to be holy.

Let us listen to the voice of the angel who told the women at the dawn of Christ's resurrection not to be afraid. This has always been the comforting words of Jesus to his disciples and to all of us who believe and trust in Him, "Do not be afraid." Many of us at this time might still be struggling to come to terms with difficulties and suffering. Let us allow the Risen Christ to fill our hearts and minds with his light. Let the radiance of his resurrection dispel the darkness of our hearts, when we are tempted to doubt, to misery and hopelessness.

How can we dispose ourselves to this gift of the resurrection of Jesus? Never underestimate the power of prayer, of reading and praying the Word of God, of sitting still in quiet and stillness with God, of telling the stories of Jesus to our children, his passion, death and resurrection. His paschal mystery is the summit of God's love shown to us. Let us continue to do the works of love flowing from our relationship with Jesus. There is glory in Jesus' death on the cross and his resurrection. Let us put our faith and trust in Him!

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Ps 138:18,5-6 I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia.

Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

FIRST READING: ACTS 10:34. 37-43

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 117:1-2. 16-17. 22-23. R. V.24

(R.) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

SECOND READING: COL 3:1-4

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Cor 5:7-8

Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Jn 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING Article 4 THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

VII. The Acts of the Penitent

1456 Confession to a priest is an essential part of the sacrament of Penance: "All mortal sins of which penitents after a diligent self-examination are conscious must be recounted by them in confession, even if they are most secret and have been committed against the last two precepts of the Decalogue; for these sins sometimes wound the soul more grievously and are more dangerous than those which are committed openly." When Christ's faithful strive to confess all the sins that they can remember, they undoubtedly place all of them before the divine mercy for pardon. But those who fail to do so and knowingly withhold some, place nothing before the divine goodness for remission through the mediation of the priest, "for if the sick person is too ashamed to show his wound to the doctor, the medicine cannot heal what it does not know."

1457 According to the Church's command, "after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Communion and there is no possibility of going to confession. Children must go to the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy Communion for the first time.

1458 Without being strictly necessary, confession of everyday faults (venial sins) is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church. Indeed the regular confession of our venial sins helps us form our conscience, fight against evil tendencies, let ourselves be healed by Christ and progress in the life of the Spirit. By receiving more frequently through this sacrament the gift of the Father's mercy, we are spurred to be merciful as he is merciful: Whoever confesses his sins . . . is already working with God. God indicts your sins; if you also indict them, you are joined with God. Man and sinner are, so to speak, two realities: when you hear "man" - this is what God has made; when you hear "sinner" - this is what man himself has made. Destroy what you have made, so that God may save what he has made When you begin to abhor what you have made, it is then that your good works are beginning, since you are accusing yourself of your evil works. the beginning of good works is the confession of evil works. You do the truth and come to the light.



Understanding the Divine Mercy

On the Sunday 28th May 2023, Fr. Chris Alar, MIC. will be celebrating Mass at St. Patrick's Church Blacktown at 10.00am followed by a talk on understanding the Divine Mercy at 11.00am. All are welcome to attend.



Father Chris Alar, MIC, entered the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception, the religious community entrusted with spreading the message and devotion of Divine Mercy, as a postulant in July 2006. Prior to that time, he received a Bachelor of Science in industrial engineering and a Masters of Business Administration (MBA) from the University of Michigan.

After working as an engineering manager at a large automotive supplier in Detroit, he began his own consulting firm in Charlotte, North Carolina, in 2000. Answering the Lord's call, he attended Franciscan University of Steubenville, in Ohio, for his philosophy studies; Dominican House of Studies in Washington, D.C., for his theology studies; and he earned his Masters of Divinity degree from Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut. He wrote and produced the popular "Divine Mercy 101" and "Explaining the Faith" DVD series and is the author of the bestselling book After Suicide: There's Hope for Them and for You, as well as Understanding Divine Mercy. He is host of the EWTN show Living Divine Mercy, which airs on Wednesdays, 6:30 p.m. EST. He serves as "Fr. Joseph, MIC," the Director of the Association of Marian Helpers, and is the head of Marian Press, located on the grounds of the National Shrine of The Divine Mercy in Stockbridge, Massachusetts.


ARTS & CRAFT MOVEMENT

RAISE THE ROOF APPEAL - NEW ROOF FOR ST. PATRICK'S CHURCH

UPDATE ON "ST. PATRICK'S RAISE THE ROOF" PROJECT

We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who shared their treasures to our church. As of 4th April 2023, we have received the sum of \$72,208.00 in donations. We are also thankful to those who are still considering... only your continued support can make the roof of the House of our God rebuild!

Where are we now? The parish maintenance volunteers in their recent meeting decided to contact the Property Manager of the Diocese of Parramatta to provide a roof expert to reassess the roof issue and provide recommendations. The Property Manager of the Diocese has advised the parish office that a Roof Auditor will be engaged towards the end of February to conduct an audit of the condition of St Patrick's Church roof and present findings to the Finance Committee, which could help to form the basis of the solution of the roof issue. We will keep you posted of the outcome. Again we ask for your patience, generosity and prayers and, thank you for your ongoing support. It is much appreciated.
