Over the next few weeks leading to Pentecost, the Church invites us to reflect on the promise of the Holy Spirit who is to come and through whom Christians are to live this new life of the Risen Lord. And in the readings for this Sunday, we are beginning to see that, as the Catechism says, "when the Spirit encounters in us the response of faith which he has aroused in us, he brings about genuine cooperation" (1091).

Now, there isn't all that much talk about the Holy Spirit yet as we begin to go through Christ's Last Supper discourse in the gospel of John. But what we have instead this week is a kind of prelude. Jesus tells his disciples that he is the Way the Truth and the Life, and then goes on to tell them that if they believe in him, then they will do the same works that he has done, and *even greater than these*. The Resurrection of Jesus offers us a new kind of existence, a new way of living. Our lives must change if we are to be his true disciples.

But any change comes first from faith. The Lord says, "do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me." if we remember that Jesus is the revelation of the Father, that his whole life here on earth is a lesson to us of the nature of God, then we can see that of anyone, he is the one in whom we should put our trust. What did Jesus reveal about God? Among other things, that he is faithful, that he keeps his promises, that he can be relied upon. Indeed, as St Peter says, he is the cornerstone which the man who rests his trust on will not be disappointed.

And so we can see that faith is God's initiative. He comes to us in so many ways to help us believe. Indeed, he promises this in our gospel today: "I will return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too." It is by the working of the Holy Spirit in our hearts that they are opened to believe in him so that we can then genuinely cooperate with his grace in our lives and live in the freedom for which he set us free, to do the same works as him, and even greater than these because of him.

Jesus said to his disciples:

There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you. I am now going to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me;

so that where I am you may be too. You know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus said: 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me.

If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.' Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me? 'To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, "Let us see the Father"?'

Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me?

The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself: it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work. You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason. 'I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.'

CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Article 4 THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION

THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

IX. The Effects of This Sacrament

1468 "The whole power of the sacrament of Penance consists in restoring us to God's grace and joining us with him in an intimate friendship."⁷³ Reconciliation with God is thus the purpose and effect of this sacrament. For those who receive the sacrament of Penance with contrite heart and religious disposition, reconciliation "is usually followed by peace and serenity of conscience with strong spiritual consolation."⁷⁴ Indeed the sacrament of Reconciliation with God brings about a true "spiritual resurrection," restoration of the dignity and blessings of the life of the children of God, of which the most precious is friendship with God.⁷⁵

1469 This sacrament reconciles us with the Church. Sin damages or even breaks fraternal communion. the sacrament of Penance repairs or restores it. In this sense it does not simply heal the one restored to ecclesial communion, but has also a revitalizing effect on the life of the Church which suffered from the sin of one of her members.⁷⁶ Re-established or strengthened in the communion of saints, the sinner is made stronger by the exchange of spiritual goods among all the living members of the Body of Christ, whether still on pilgrimage or already in the heavenly homeland.⁷⁷

It must be recalled that . . . this reconciliation with God leads, as it were, to other reconciliations, which repair the other breaches caused by sin. the forgiven penitent is reconciled with himself in his inmost being, where he regains his innermost truth. He is reconciled with his brethren whom he has in some way offended and wounded. He is reconciled with the Church. He is reconciled with all creation.⁷⁸

1470 In this sacrament, the sinner, placing himself before the merciful judgment of God, anticipates in a certain way the judgment to which he will be subjected at the end of his earthly life. For it is now, in this life, that we are offered the choice between life and death, and it is only by the road of conversion that we can enter the Kingdom, from which one is excluded by grave sin.⁷⁹ In converting to Christ through penance and faith, the sinner passes from death to life and "does not come into judgment."⁸⁰



SYNOD ~ DIOCESE OF PARRAMATTA

The Bishop has formerly announced, and work is well underway, for a Diocesan Synod.

A Synod is an event where clergy, religious, and the laity gather to discuss important matters relating to the life and mission of the Church. But before the "main event" in October, there is a big process of collating feedback from as many people as possible.



It's a big task, but an important one as we want to hear everyone's perspective on the future and life of our Church here in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains. This is the first ever Synod for our Diocese, but it's not out of the blue. For the last few years, there have been many national and international Synods, as well as the Australian Plenary Council. And now it's time for us as a Diocese to come together and be part of this transformative process and event that leads to renewal in the Church's life.

OUR PARISHES SYNOD PROCESS

Fr. Regie has appointed Blake Bano and Richard Desa to represent the parish to lead, meet and organise spiritual conversations on the themes for the Synod.

There has been a steering committee formed made up of members of the Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, and ministry leads.

Our parish synod committee have met and they will be organising a Synod information and consultation night for parishioners to attend in the near future. It is our aim that as a parish we will submit a report to the Diocese of the views of our parishioners on where is God calling Mary Queen of the Family Parish today?

The purpose is to catechise our children and help them learn about Jesus and the story of Salvation.


All children from ages 2-12 and who have not yet received First Holy Communion are very welcome.
