Our Gospel this week continues where we had left off, with Jesus giving instructions to his disciples about how they are to fulfil the mission entrusted to them. In the first section of this passage, Jesus sets the bar for his would-be followers: our love for him must exceed even that of our most important human relationships. This lesson of the Lord ends with the famous line, "anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it." What Jesus expects of those who would come after him, with his very own mission, is to follow the example he set in his life, death and resurrection. More than anything, what characterises his life on earth was his self -emptying love manifested to us on the Cross. He left nothing in reserve but gave of himself entirely out of love to the Father for us sinners. If his disciples are to be fruitful in the mission entrusted to them, they must open their hearts to the same kind of love, since without their witness of life, their words would become like chaff in the wind. The disciples of Jesus must be so taken with him, with his love, that in a sense, nothing else matters.

Our love for him must mean we are willing to give up everything in order to have him. If there are things in our life, even the most important of relationships, that we place before him and what he asks of us, then we are holding too much back for ourselves. Our love has not yet become that kind of self-emptying love with which Jesus loves us. "Unless a grain of wheat dies it remains alone. But if it dies it bears much fruit," says the Lord. If we want to follow Jesus, to truly be his disciples, we must recognise those areas in our lives where we hesitate, where we reserve things for ourselves, those things which we have not surrendered to the Lord. Otherwise, our service of Him won't bear the fruit it ought to. A priest once said to me, if you're only going to give 99% then don't bother becoming a priest. Now this isn't to say that the Lord places heavy burdens on us. It's merely to recognise that our condition is such that the more we give ourselves in love, the more we truly live.

Alleluia, alleluia! You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy people. Praise God who called you out of darkness and into his marvellous light. Alleluia!	<b>1504</b> Often Jesus asks the sick to believe. <sup>107</sup> He makes use of signs to heal: spittle and the laying on of hands, <sup>108</sup> mud and washing. <sup>109</sup> The sick try to touch him, "for power came forth from him and healed them all." <sup>110</sup> and so in the sacraments Christ continues to "touch" us in order to heal us.
GOSPEL: Mt 10:37-42 Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. 'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.	<b>1505</b> Moved by so much suffering Christ not only allows himself to be touched by the sick, but he makes their miseries his own: "He took our infirmities and bore our diseases." <sup>111</sup> But he did not heal all the sick. His healings were signs of the coming of the Kingdom of God. They anounced a more radical healing: the victory over sin and death through his Passover. On the cross Christ took upon himself the whole weight of evil and took away the "sin of the world," <sup>112</sup> of which illness is only a consequence. By his passion and death on the cross Christ has given a new meaning to suffering: it can henceforth configure us to him and unite us with his redemptive Passion.
'Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward. 'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'	"Heal the sick" <b>1506</b> Christ invites his disciples to follow him by taking up their cross in their turn. <sup>113</sup> By following him they acquire a new outlook on illness and the sick. Jesus associates them with his own life of poverty and service. He makes them share in his ministry of compassion and healing: "So they went out and preached that men should repent, and they cast out many

All rights</li> </ul>	demons, and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them." <sup>114</sup> <b>1507</b> The risen Lord renews this mission ("In my name they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover." <sup>115</sup> ) and confirms it through the signs that the Church performs by invoking his name. <sup>116</sup> These signs demonstrate in a special way that Jesus is truly "God who saves." <sup>117</sup>
