Do Not Be Afraid, Be My Witnesses

This Sunday's readings challenge us not to be afraid but be witnesses of Jesus Christ. We are to preach and proclaim his Gospels boldly without fear. We know that sometimes we fear as a protective purpose to achieve great things. In our Christians perspective, fear is from evil, and it can be an enemy to our faith or may be due to a weak faith. We fear authority and persecution because we want to avoid pain and sufferings. But in the face of a duty to preach and proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom, we have to move on despite all difficulties of pain and suffering. We are always safe in God's hands.

In the Gospel, Jesus said to his disciples, "Do not be afraid" three times. Powerful words. Maybe Jesus warns his disciples: "Behold, I am sending you like sheep in the midst of wolves," (Mt 10:16). When Jesus sent out his disciples to be witnesses to his mission and preach his Gospels, he urges them to trust in God. God knows the detail of their lives. They should know He will give them strength, support, and protection in carrying out the mission. Jesus encourages his disciples not to fear those who can kill the body, evil ones have no power to kill the soul. And this is the promise of God right from the beginning of Salvation history throughout human life in which God rewards His children with enteral kingdom.

In the first reading, the same message is conveyed to us. Jeremiah was constantly threatened to fear his enemies. Why should he not fear? Because he was not a predator. He was God's prophet who proclaimed the truth to his people who needed to hear the message of God. As we know, truth always hurts, because those who do not accept the message kill the body. How many are there who suffered the same fate as Jeremiah. They are many every day. They are killed by their own people. But God spoke to His people through His Son Jesus Christ who suffered like the prophets. Despite life's trial and uncertainties, Christ offers his firm light, shining on our way, revealing eternal truths, and removing fears, doubts, and false ideas.

And so, on this Sunday, Jesus challenges us to examine ourselves especially our faith that drives us to know the truth. "Do not be afraid," because it is Christ's love that drives away all fear. Our opponents will not be able to prevent us from following Jesus in our mission because God plans cannot be changed at all. "Everything that is now covered will be uncovered." The Lord "will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness," (1 Cor 4:5). Our God will not allow evil to win and block our way, only the light of Christ will continue to shine in our lives. God is watching over us. He gives us comfort, strength, and hope, especially in times of difficulty and danger. May we continue to praise His name. Amen.



CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING Article 5 THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

I. Its Foundations in the Economy of Salvation

1500 Illness and suffering have always been among the gravest problems confronted in human life. In illness, man experiences his powerlessness, his limitations, and his finitude. Every illness can make us glimpse death.

1501 Illness can lead to anguish, self-absorption, sometimes even despair and revolt against God. It can also make a person more mature, helping him discern in his life what is not essential so that he can turn toward that which is. Very often illness provokes a search for God and a return to him.

The sick person before God

1502 The man of the Old Testament lives his sickness in the presence of God. It is before God that he laments his illness, and it is of God, Master of life and death, that he implores healing. 98 Illness becomes a way to conversion; God's forgiveness initiates the healing. 99 It is the experience of Israel that illness is mysteriously linked to sin and evil, and that faithfulness to God according to his law restores life: "For I am the Lord, your healer." 100 The prophet intuits that suffering can also have a redemptive meaning for the sins of others. 101 Finally Isaiah announces that God will usher in a time for Zion when he will pardon every offense and heal every illness. 102

Christ the physician

1503 Christ's compassion toward the sick and his many healings of every kind of infirmity are a resplendent sign that "God has visited his people" and that the Kingdom of God is close at hand. Jesus has the power not only to heal, but also to forgive sins; 104 he has come to heal the whole man, soul and body; he is the physician the sick have need of. 105 His compassion toward all who suffer goes so far that he identifies himself with them: "I was sick and you visited me." His preferential love for the sick has not ceased through the centuries to draw the very special attention of Christians toward all those who suffer in body and soul. It is the source of tireless efforts to comfort them.




