# Weeds among the Wheat

Again, on this 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time of Year A, we hear in chapter 13 of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus continues to teach the crowds with long and complex parables. Jesus breaks the parable into three parts. In the first part, Jesus uses a good seed that was sown in the field, unfortunately an enemy came at night and sowed weeds all through the wheat. The work of the enemy was a cruel act on the farmer who sacrificed and sweated to feed his family, and the society. The weeds stand for evil people who are unrepentant, whose aim is to destroy the righteous, the wheat.

As Jesus himself explains clearly in the parable, there are always two views of the Church, those who see the Church with evil eyes, no faith, no appreciation on good work the Church is doing. And for us the baptised Christians, what do we do with such people who are weeds among us. Christians have visible eyes, have faith to tackle evil through bearing the cross of Jesus Christ. As St Paul said in the second reading, the spirit comes to strengthen and encourage us to live and evangelise among the weeds. The Christians are the building bridges in our broken world full of hatred, discrimination, division, prejudice, and harm to fellow human beings.

Thanks to Jesus Christ for fulfilling the promise of the Father for bringing us to understand the kingdom of heaven. He did not weed out Judas Iscariot who betrayed him, or Simon Peter who denied him not once, but three times. He knew the honest man has stolen something in his life, and this also happens to us in our family, with friends, and the society. It does not mean that all people are betrayers or deniers.

To be Christian is to resist evil and to overcome it by doing good. Every Christian suffers from the result of our fallen world that causes wounds. We are all sinners. We are all wounded, and the wounds go deep, caused by the sins of other people, sometimes in a clear way or in a hidden way. Yet, the wheat can grow among the weeds. We grow among the evil doers, and Christianity will continue to survive.

This is the time for Christians to stand up to preach and proclaim the truth of Jesus Christ. It is a chance for conversion, a time to pray for the conversion of weeds to wheat. Let us take the example of Jesus Christ, who was tolerant to those who criticise him throughout his life. The evil always annoys us, differs from our teaching, makes too much noise, and disturbs us. The evil tests us and makes it difficult for our spiritual growth, with bad practices and examples. The evil does not adhere to our Christian values. We must hold firm not to be discouraged when we are tempted. Through our Christian struggles we can grow. Amen.

# THE LITURGY

#### SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME~ YEAR A

#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Psalm 53:6,8**

See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

FIRST READING: Wisdom 12:13.16-19

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 85:5-6. 9-10. 15-16. R. V.5

(R.) Lord, you are good and forgiving. SECOND READING: ROM 8:26-27

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: See Mt 11:25

Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth; you have revealed to little ones the mysteries of the kingdom. Alleluia!

#### GOSPEL: Mt 13:24-43

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.' He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.' In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfill the prophecy:

I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.' He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

# CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING Article 5 THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

II. Who Receives and Who Administers This Sacrament? In case of grave illness . . .

**1514** The Anointing of the Sick "is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." <sup>129</sup>

1515 If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. the same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced.

" . . . let him call for the presbyters of the Church"

**1516** Only priests (bishops and presbyters) are ministers of the Anointing of the Sick. <sup>130</sup> It is the duty of pastors to instruct the faithful on the benefits of this sacrament. The faithful should encourage the sick to call for a priest to receive this sacrament. The sick should prepare themselves to receive it with good dispositions, assisted by their pastor and the whole ecclesial community, which is invited to surround the sick in a special way through their prayers and fraternal attention.
