Baptisms, Marriages, Funerals & Anointing of the Sick

My dear friends. It is with a mixture of sadness and joy that I leave you as I begin to serve the Lord in his priesthood. My time among you has been very blessed. I am so grateful that I had the opportunity to be with you for the last 18 months, to get to know you, and to serve you where I was able. I have been so blessed by your constant support and encouragement over my time with you which buoyed me up so well as I made my final preparations for the priesthood. You have thus contributed significantly to laying a good foundation in me for the work the Lord wants to do in and through me now as his priest.

This weekend in our reading from the prophet Isaiah, the Lord speaks metaphorically of the disappointment he has experienced because of those leaders to whom he entrusted the care of his vineyard. This, his treasured vineyard, has not born him the rich fruits with which he can produce the finest wine, but has instead only left him sour grapes, unfit for consumption. Jesus echoes this metaphor in his parable about the wicked tenants – those entrusted with the care of the Lord's vineyard have gone astray and even when prophets were sent among them to bring them back to the way of the Lord, to remain faithful to his covenant with them, they did not heed. Instead, they dealt wickedly with these prophets, not only rejecting their message, but rejecting them, persecuting them and putting them to death. Jesus assures his audience, the leaders of the people, that for these wicked tenants, a sour, wretched end is in store.

The Lord renews this warning in the very heart of the Church, calling her leaders to take heed of the message of the prophets, to repent and be converted once more, so that they may be faithful tenants in the vineyard of the Lord and produce the fruits that befit the Kingdom of God. It is thus vital that we pray for our leaders, especially our priests, who have been entrusted with this care of the Lord's vineyard.

In the last supper discourse in John's gospel, Jesus instructs the apostles how it is that they are to remain fruitful in his vineyard. It is only those who remain in him, those friends of his that abide in his love, who allow themselves to be pruned with care by the Father, that bear good fruit in the vineyard. Many things badger priests for their attention, draw them away from what is essential and can lead them to be like those withered branches that the Father cuts away to be burned. So, pray that your priests might remain faithful to the one thing necessary, to remain close to Jesus so that they might be good and faithful stewards of the vineyard, and pray this intention especially for me as I now begin this life as his priest.

I love you all very much and I look fondly upon the time I've spent with you. Thanks for everything – I'll be seeing you around!



Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 7: Sacramental Signs

The Catholic Church teaches that a sacrament is an outward sign, instituted by Christ, to give grace. Or as the Catechism of the Catholic Church puts it:

The sacraments are efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. $(n^{\circ}. 1131)$

In any case, a sacrament is comprised of two parts: the perceptible sign. It is something we can see, or smell, or touch, or taste, or hear. In the tradition, this is called the "sacramentum." Then there is the invisible reality, called the "res" by the tradition. It is ultimately the grace of God.

We should consider these two things in every sacramental experience. Ideally the meaning of the sacramental sign should be evident. For this to happen, though, we must be completely invested in the Christian culture from which the meaning flows.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

...the visible signs used by the liturgy to signify invisible divine things have been chosen by Christ or the Church. Thus not only when things are read "which were written for our instruction" (Rom. 15:4), but also when the Church prays or sings or acts, the faith of those taking part is nourished and their minds are raised to God, so that they may offer Him their rational service and more abundantly receive His grace. (n°. 33)

IN THE TRADITION

There can be no religious society, whether the religion be true or false, without some sacrament or visible symbol to serve as a bond of union. The importance of these sacraments cannot be overstated, and only scoffers will treat them lightly. Augustine of Hippo, Contra Faustum, n°. 19.11

THE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH

"From where do the sacramental signs come? Some come from created things (light, water, fire, bread, wine, oil); others come from social life (washing, anointing, breaking of bread). Still others come from the history of salvation in the Old Covenant (the Passover rites, the sacrifices, the laying on of hands, the consecrations). These signs, some of which are normative and unchangeable, were taken up by Christ and are made the bearers of his saving and sanctifying action."

REFLECTION

Mission....We need to avoid [becoming closed persons] by making the Church constantly go out from herself, keeping her mission focused on Jesus Christ, and her commitment to the poor" (Evangelii Gaudium, 97). Only a heart open to mission can ensure that everything we do, ad intra and ad extra, is marked by the regenerating power of the Lord's call. Mission always involves passion for the poor, for those who are "in need", not only of things material, but also spiritual, emotional and moral. Those who hunger for bread and those who hunger for meaning are equally poor. The Church is summoned to reach out to every form of poverty. The Church is called to preach the Gospel to everyone, since all of us are poor; all of us are, in one way or another, needy. But the Church also reaches out to the poor because we need them: we need their voice, their presence, their questions and criticisms. A person with a missionary heart feels the absence of his brother or sister, and, like a beggar, accosts him or her. Mission makes us vulnerable. This is beautiful, that mission makes us vulnerable. It helps remind us that we are disciples and it makes us rediscover ever anew the joy of the Gospel.
