Baptisms, Marriages, Funerals & Anointing of the Sick

November begins for the Church a sort-of unofficial Liturgical season dedicated to praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory preparing to achieve the eternal bliss of beatitude in heaven. The unofficial season is bookended by two significant feast days: The Solemnity of All the Saints, and the Feast of Christ the King of the Universe. This latter feast marks an end to our liturgical calendar and the glory to come, so it seems only fitting that our minds and prayers are directed to the "last things" (death, heaven, hell, and judgement). The fixture in the liturgical calendar in having All Saints and All Souls consecutively captures the seemingly awkward tension in Christian death and mourning, for at once we mourn the loss that we suffer, and yet we must always ground ourselves in the Christian virtue of hope, especially in the loving mercy of God in the salvific act of Christ's sacrifice, hence the need to not forget the faithful departed, but continuing to remember, offering up penance and prayers on their behalf. This season truly displays the broad and dynamic communion of the Church: the Church Militant (on earth), the Church Suffering (in purgatory), and the Church Triumphant (in heaven).

The practices for the dead associated with this month reflect a tried and tested component of the Catholic spiritual life known as memento mori (remember your death/that you must die). It's a realistic, reflective Christian practice compelling us to prepare for the last day, or as the psalms remind us, that our days are numbered. One might think, for example, of Ebaneezer Scrooge's warning from his deceased friend, Jacob Marley. It should drive the urgency to radically respond to the gospel call to repentance and conversion, that we, like Christ, should be ready to willingly accept our death and be united to the Godhead in heavenly glory. Though in our current culture, it mightn't seem a popular or worthwhile practice, even somewhat morbid, though it is a challenge to confront the awkward reality of death, at once reminding us of our earthly mortality and our spiritual immortality.

So, in this month, take courage to approach the looming reality which speaks the end of this life and the beginning of the next. Do not suppress or ignore the pain all humanity shares in the grief of loss, but approach with prayer in the refuge of God and His Church. As a family or with friends, visit the graves of your dearly departed and offer prayers, or light a candle and ask for our Blessed Mother's intercession. The parish has at each church a book of remembrance, and the opportunity to offer Masses throughout the whole month by completing and submitting the yellow envelopes available.





ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 11: Unity and Diversity in the Mass

The Church's most fundamental principle in the celebration of Mass is that of unity. She has no greater interest than to foster unity when remembering the great sacrifice of Christ for love of us. Our harmony with one another sacramentalizes our unity with him. Catholics express this unity by participating in the common texts, postures and gestures.

Saint Pope John XXIII was very clear when in 1959 he urged that Catholics observe "unity in necessary things, liberty in doubtful things, charity in all things—in necessariis unitas, in dubiis libertas, in omnibus caritas."

In the celebration of the liturgy, there remains room for legitimate diversity. As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal notes however, adaptation is not to be arbitrary. From the early days of Christianity, the Church has recommended a common sense approach. Saint Augustine tells us certain things "ought to be observed for the sake of fellowship with those among whom we live." (Cf. Letter to Januarius, Chapter 2.)

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

Liturgical services are not private functions, but are celebrations of the Church, which is the "sacrament of unity," namely, the holy people united and ordered under their bishops. (n°. 26)

General Instruction of the Roman Missal

In the celebration of Mass the faithful form a holy people, a people of God's own possession and a royal Priesthood, so that they may give thanks to God and offer the unblemished sacrificial Victim not only by means of the hands of the Priest but also together with him and so that they may learn to offer their very selves.

IN THE TRADITION

Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment* on himself. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29

THE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH

"Liturgical diversity can be a source of enrichment, but it can also provoke tensions, mutual misunderstandings, and even schisms. In this matter it is clear that diversity must not damage unity. It must express only fidelity to the common faith, to the sacramental signs that the Church has received from Christ, and to hierarchical communion. Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), n°. 1206.



We are inviting parishioners and friends to our annual Parish Christmas Gala.



We have received a couple of quotes and waiting for 2 more quotes from roofers recommended by the Diocese, and then we will
