**a** Call to Vigilance

Saint Paul catches our attention on the Second Coming of Christ that points to the eschatological reality of the Last Judgement. The manner and time this will happen is uncertain. The general advice given is to be prepared at all times for the Judge will come like a thief in the night. Let us be alert and sober.

The liturgy in its readings has laid the foundations on how to respond to the call to vigilance. King Solomon in his Book of Wisdom has set before us the image of "A Woman of Worth". Her faithfulness to her husband is so exemplary that she would always perform her duties and responsibilities to serve him. She also has the discerning spirit to listen to her conscience where God speaks so much so that she would only do what is good and avoid anything that is evil. Her fidelity towards her husband is nothing but an expression of her total dedication to the will of God. Moreover, she would not limit to fulfill the demands of justice but practice in her life acts of charity as she extends to reach out those who are helpless and give to the poor.

The gospel's Parable of the Talents gives an idea of what will happen at the end. All will be judged according to one's deeds. It advices that it is precisely important to develop the talents each is given by God. Looking closely at this parable, there are at least two important lessons to reflect. Firstly, God is giving differing talents. Different talents to different people. The focus is not on the talent but on how one disposes it. Each person has to lay the talent no matter how great or small to the service of God. No one should keep their talent for themself. Lastly, the reward for the work well done is the more work we do. For those who have more, more will be given. This is how to keep serving God at all times.

A Call to Vigilance is to meet our duties and responsibilities and perform acts of love. Discerning always the Will of God so that everything that is done may always be in accord to His plan. What lies ahead may be uncertain but one may rejoice on the certainty that everything is for God's greater glory.



Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out. The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir", he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.""

# ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

# Episode 11: Unity and Diversity in the Mass

The Church's most fundamental principle in the celebration of Mass is that of unity. She has no greater interest than to foster unity when remembering the great sacrifice of Christ for love of us. Our harmony with one another sacramentalizes our unity with him. Catholics express this unity by participating in the common texts, postures and gestures.

Saint Pope John XXIII was very clear when in 1959 he urged that Catholics observe "unity in necessary things, liberty in doubtful things, charity in all things—in necessariis unitas, in dubiis libertas, in omnibus caritas."

In the celebration of the liturgy, there remains room for legitimate diversity. As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal notes however, adaptation is not to be arbitrary. From the early days of Christianity, the Church has recommended a common sense approach. Saint Augustine tells us certain things "ought to be observed for the sake of fellowship with those among whom we live." (Cf. Letter to Januarius, Chapter 2.)

## Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

Liturgical services are not private functions, but are celebrations of the Church, which is the "sacrament of unity," namely, the holy people united and ordered under their bishops.  $(n^{\circ}. 26)$ 

## General Instruction of the Roman Missal

In the celebration of Mass the faithful form a holy people, a people of God's own possession and a royal Priesthood, so that they may give thanks to God and offer the unblemished sacrificial Victim not only by means of the hands of the Priest but also together with him and so that they may learn to offer their very selves.

## IN THE TRADITION

Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment\* on himself. **1 Corinthians 11:27-29** 

## THE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH

"Liturgical diversity can be a source of enrichment, but it can also provoke tensions, mutual misunderstandings, and even schisms. In this matter it is clear that diversity must not damage unity. It must express only fidelity to the common faith, to the sacramental signs that the Church has received from Christ, and to hierarchical communion. Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC),  $n^{\circ}$ , 1206.



### Have you ever wondered about ?


