# "The Five-Finger Gospel"

The Solemnity of Christ the King closes the liturgical calendar of the Ordinary Time. The following week begins the season of Advent anticipating the great feast of the coming of the Son of God, of the Word made flesh, of the presence of God in humanity through Jesus Christ. The season of Advent also looks forward for the second coming of Christ the King ushering the fulness of a new creation and a new world where God will be all in all. This King uttered these words in our Gospel this Sunday (Matthew 25:31-46), "I assure you, as often as you did it for one of my least brothers (and sisters), you did it for me." "You-did-it-for-me." Mother Teresa of Calcutta was deeply touched by these words of Jesus that all throughout her life as a Missionary of Charity she served her King and master who said these words to her and to all of us. She championed in the world this beautiful image of a five-finger Gospel.

She said, "Our work for the poor is so real so beautiful because if our heart is pure, we can see, we can touch Jesus twenty-four hours because He has made it so clear: Whatever you do to the least of my brethren- You-did-it-to-Me. The Gospel in our five fingers- that is why we need that deep life of prayer- that will help us to grow in that intimate and personal love for Jesus and complete attachment to Him- so that our sisters and our poor can see Jesus in us, His love, His compassion." She knew very well what poverty really means and why Jesus is thirsting for us to satisfy him, to serve him as a King who first of all offered his life on the cross as his throne.

Mother Teresa reminds the world, however, that poverty is not only material, but also of love. This is the most challenging one to address especially when our hearts are hardened with greed, selfishness and pride. The exact antithesis of love is not hatred but indifference. Our self-centeredness blinds us to look beyond that there are so many who are hungry, thirsty, abandoned. We can only give what we have. This is the reason why we must come to the one who loved us first. Mother Teresa always began her day adoring our Eucharistic King, united with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and then serve him in others especially the poorest of the poor.

Saint Paul (1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28) reiterates that at the end of time Christ will come as a King over all, "When, after having destroyed every sovereignty, authority, and power, will hand over the kingdom to God the Father. Christ must reign until God has put all enemies under his feet, and the last enemy to be destroyed is death. When, finally, all has been subjected to the Son, he will then subject himself to the One who made all things subject to him, so that God may be all in all." The ultimate criterion of judgment Jesus proposed in the Gospel narrative is the measure in which we love others especially the poor, the weak, and the vulnerable. For whatever we do to them, we do it for Jesus. This is simply the five-finger ~ Fr. Regie Lavilla MST. Gospel!

Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'

# **ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS**

# Episode 12: Music and the Mass

Music, in the mind of the Church, is not thought of as something added to the Mass; rather, music is an **integral component** of it.

The Church describes her music as a treasure of inestimable value— and indeed, how rich is this musical heritage. As a unique combination of melody and word, sacred music was created for the worship of God; it forms a necessary part of the sacred liturgy.

From the earliest days of the Church, the Catholic tradition has understood the working of the Blessed Trinity as a dialogue of love—not simply a spoken dialogue, but an eternal love song. Fathers of the Church, such as Saint Augustine, show how this sacred music both expresses and inspires our religious devotion. When we sing at Mass, we follow the example of the Trinity. When we participate in the hymn of praise of Jesus Christ to God his Father, when we join our voices to his, our song at Mass becomes a joining in the eternal love song of heaven.

#### Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

Christ Jesus, high priest of the new and eternal covenant, taking human nature, introduced into this earthly exile that hymn which is sung throughout all ages in the halls of heaven. He joins the entire community of mankind to Himself, associating it with His own singing of this canticle of divine praise.

#### Musicam Sacram

Liturgical worship is given a more noble form when it is celebrated in song. The mystery of the liturgy, with its hierarchical and community nature, is more openly shown, the unity of hearts is more profoundly achieved by the union of voices, minds are more easily raised to heavenly things by the beauty of the sacred rites, and the whole celebration more clearly prefigures that heavenly liturgy which is enacted in the holy city of Jerusalem.





#### St Patrick's Church – Raise the Roof Project

We have received a couple of quotes and waiting for 2 more quotes from roofers recommended by the Diocese, and then we will



meet with the Head of the Property section of the Diocese to finalise the roof and ceiling refurbishment of our St Patrick's church. We have also received the cash settlement from Catholic Church Insurance, which amount augment our roof and ceiling repair funding, (inclusive of donation), to \$193,789.15.

Who were the wise men that came to visit Jesus? ? Did they really follow a star?


What prophecies about the star and the "new king" were mentioned in the Old Testament?
