A Call to the Virtue of Humility.

The Church's Liturgical calendar in the month of November calls us to pray for the repose of the souls of our deceased relatives. In addition to pray for the dead, we who are alive should remind ourselves that we too will be heading the same way. The way is a narrow gate. As such, St Matthew's Gospel calls us to the virtue of humility. The word humility signifies lowliness or submissiveness, and it is derived from the Latin word "humiliates". The humble person submits him or herself to God and to others to be exalted by God's future kingdom.

In the past few Sundays, Jesus has been criticizing the religious leaders, the Scribes, and the Pharisees, challenging them about the Kingdom of heaven. No one can enter the Kingdom of heaven, no one can escape the condemnation to the flames unless he or she changes his or her attitude and behaviour.

And so, this Sunday Jesus shifts his attention to the ordinary people and the disciples. He wants the people and the disciples not to follow the example of the religious leaders in their ways of acting. He preaches to the people and disciples to observe all things and be different from those religious leaders who were pretending to be experts and observers of God's Law publicly, but they were hypocrites and corrupted.

Jesus tells the people and the disciples to be separate from these religious leaders. Why? Because it is an attitude towards others which is the difference. It is when we begin to look down on others and do not share. We begin to think less of others. If we do that, we are like the modern Pharisees claimed to be holy in public places, but behind there is something wrong. Jesus calls the Scribes and Pharisees as hypocrites. He relates hypocrites like acting in a movie in the theatre or pretending to be at the top of the play. They turned away from the virtue of humility. Jesus does not welcome that in the Gospel today.

For us Catholics, when we gather at Mass, we share one Body and Blood of Christ. After sharing at Mass, we are sent forth to share the way we share at Mass. If we do not share, then we are actors and pretenders in the movie like the religious leaders. We just attend Mass as attractive attention, seeking notice, sitting on best seats. No, we are followers of Jesus Chris. That is the answer.

So today, Christ calls us to be humble servants and genuine Christians, not half-hearted. Leaders should have a spirit of humble service in thought, word, and deed. Let us open our hearts in everything that brings glory to God and His family. Amen.



You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 10: Who Says the Mass Is Boring?

One often hears that **Mass** is boring. I like to say that if you find it boring, you're looking at the wrong thing. You are probably focused on its structure. Ritual requires structure.

And so there is a sense in which Mass is the same: it's supposed to be repetitive! Repetition is absolutely essential in any ritual; and so it is with the Mass. At Mass we should know what to expect. On the other hand, irregularity in ritual means distraction. Distraction calls attention to itself, and thus away from God.

But let repetition not mean "boring". Rather let us try to see the structure of the Mass as regular and familiar. Let the ritual provide a comfortable place for prayer to happen. Structure in the Mass is like the skeleton of our bodies: it provides a stable place for the "muscle" of meaning to be attached. The regular structure helps us to focus on prayer.

When you are at Mass, consider the uniqueness of the texts, the prayers, the readings, the liturgical season and the community there.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

Finally, there must be no innovations unless the good of the Church genuinely and certainly requires them; and care must be taken that any new forms adopted should in some way grow organically from forms already existing. (n°. 23)

General Instruction of the Roman Missal

The Mass consists in some sense of two parts, namely the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, these being so interconnected that they form but one single act of worship. (n°. 28)

IN THE TRADITION

Take to heart these words which I command you today. Keep repeating them to your children. Recite them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you get up. Bind them on your arm as a sign and let them be as a pendant on your forehead. Write them on the doorposts of your houses and on your gates. Deuteronomy 6:6-9

THE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH

"This living transmission, accomplished in the Holy Spirit, is called Tradition, since it is distinct from Sacred Scripture, though closely connected to it. [...] Through Tradition, 'the Church, in her doctrine, life and worship, perpetuates and transmits to every generation all that she herself is, all that she believes." 

We have received a couple of quotes and waiting for 2 more quotes from roofers recommended by the Diocese, and then we will

meet with the Head of the Property section of the Diocese to finalise the roof and ceiling refurbishment of our St Patrick's church. We have also received the cash settlement from Catholic Church Insurance, which amount augment our roof and ceiling repair funding, (inclusive of donation), to \$187,811.15
