SUNDAY CONNECTION

Today's Gospel is taken from the beginning of Mark. Unlike Luke and Matthew, Mark does not include any details of Jesus' birth. Instead Mark begins with the appearance of John the Baptist in the desert. On this the Second Sunday of Advent, we are invited to reflect upon the role of John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus and the salvation that he would bring

Mark's description of the appearance of John the Baptist highlights John's continuity with the Jewish prophetic tradition. Mark combines quotations from the Old Testament books of Malachi, Isaiah, and Exodus. Mark's description of John as an ascetic, living in the desert, clothed in camel hair, and eating locusts and wild honey, is reminiscent of the description of the prophet Elijah found in Second Kings. The people of Judea and Jerusalem flock to him, listening to his message of repentance and forgiveness; they also come to him to be baptized. Mark's Gospel is clear, however, that John the Baptist's role is only to prepare the way for another who will come, one who is greater than John.

Many scholars believe that the Gospels reflect the tension that likely existed between followers of John the Baptist and disciples of Jesus. Each of the four Evangelists report on John's preaching and baptizing, and they each emphasize the importance of Jesus' baptism by John. The four Gospels also explain that John was sent to preach in preparation for another. In the Gospel of Luke, the question is raised as to whether John the Baptist was himself the Messiah, Just as in today's Gospel, however, John speaks quite explicitly that the Messiah was to come after him.

In today's Gospel we hear John the Baptist contrast his baptism of repentance with the baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John says that he has baptized with water, but that the one who is to come will baptize with the Holy Spirit. John's baptism was not yet a Christian baptism, but a preparation for the Sacrament of Baptism through which sins are forgiven and the gift of the Holy Spirit is received.

John the Baptist is presented to us as a model during Advent. We, too, are called upon to prepare a way for the Lord. Like John the Baptist, we are messengers in service to one who is greater than we are. Our Baptism commissions us to call others to life as disciples of Jesus.



All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins.

John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 14: What is the Collect?

"Collect" is the official term for what is generally known as the Opening Prayer of the Mass. This term is significant because it suggests how we ought to approach the opening oration.

The prayer is preceded by the invitation of the priest: "Let us pray." Note that these words do not mean "Bring me the book" or "Please stand," or "Watch while I turn through the pages," or even "Listen to this prayer." The invitation means first and foremost "Let us formulate the intentions we want to offer at this Mass."

In silence, the entire assembly is joined in prayer. The Collect gathers these silent prayers. At the Preparation of the Offerings, let the silence be an opportunity for each to say, "Lord, I offer myself to you, completely and entirely."

After Holy Communion, let it be "O Lord, thank you for this great gift of yourself; unite me to yourself." In the end, every participant in the Mass should learn to pray in silence.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

The prayers addressed to God by the priest who presides over the assembly in the person of Christ are said in the name of the entire holy people and of all present.



MQOF Parish - A Pastoral Report for 2023

Rites of passage with our Mission

Brothers & Sisters in Christ. My name is Cecil Fernandes – I have been a parishioner in MQOF for the last 25 years and am also the Chairman of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). It is my pleasure to be able to present our Parish's 2023 annual Pastoral report. The PPC has a charter to support our Priests and shares with them the responsibility for the development of the Parish Community of faith, and the Mission of the Church within the Parish.

Our Parish mission is – To strive to live as a faithful and committed Catholic community, continuing to deepen in understanding the Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture of the Catholic Church and to grow as missionary disciples of Jesus Christ, evangelising and responding to the needs of the family in the Blacktown community and beyond.

A Pastoral evaluation

Firstly, we are so blessed to have such a good Parish Priest in Fr. Regie Lavilla – who true to his title is a missionary at heart. It is through his missionary zeal & prompting that the seeds of missionary discipleship are being sown. Supported by Fr. Ever Bernaldez & Fr. Andrew Rooney (we love their homily's too – explaining the Word (our daily bread) within the heart of the Sacramental sacrifice of the mass – in obedience to the Sacred Tradition) – they continue to be committed to the Sacramental life of the Parish, with 2 masses daily, 7 masses on the weekends, confessions & adoration twice a week in both the churches of St. Michaels & St. Patricks. Of-course we also have 10 ministries within the umbrella of the parish.

We pray & hope that the members of these various ministries continue to grow as active missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. The Legion of Mary in both St. Michael's & St. Patricks keep the devotion/s to our Lady – with the rotation of 3-5 statues to different homes in the Parish for 2 week durations. They also door knock and meet people in their home, share their faith with them & invite them to our church.

This year we re-started the Children's liturgy program during both the 9.30am and 10am masses on Sunday's and the Lord has blessed us with 4 young teachers – who look after nearly 60-70 children below the age of 11 that attend these programs. A PPC sub-committee has chalked out their faith learning plan for them for the next one year.

These children we hope will go onto our various Sacramental programs of 1st Holy Communion, Reconciliation & Confirmation. These programs are planned & executed throughout the year with 6 weeks of preparatory activity that involves educating not only the children, but also their parents in the Sacraments they will receive.

We have received very positive feedback from the Parents on the content & format of the programs. A big thank you to Ged for that. This year 79 children received their first Holy Communion, 79 had their first reconciliation and 142 were confirmed in their faith. However sadly, our reality is that for quite a few of these children it will also be their last encounter with the sacraments. More prayer & work for us as a Parish in this space. Of course last year we were all praying and watching to see if we could muster enough youth to gather regularly, this year sparked by our World Youth Day – the Parish was able to partially support over 10 youth to go to World Youth Day and the fruits of those seeding are now being seen as they gather not only at their Monthly adoration, but also their regular catchups, Guest speakers (Theology of the body series), faith sharing & choir activities. Please pray that they may grow deeper & deeper in love with Jesus Christ through the friendships that they forge, knowing that these friendships will remain with them through their lives.





Thanks also to our Priests, Deacon John & then Deacon Tom- who performed all these Baptisms week after week on Sundays. This year 153 people were baptised including (102 - below 1, 56 - between 1 & 7 years, 3 - over years, 2 - Adults).

Our RCIA team have over the past 3 years put together a program that the 12 candidates that attend loved very much. Last year we had 4 candidates & this year there are 5 in the pipeline.

Our Parish Bible class which is held every Thursday – ably led by Richard & Marina Dsa – continue to grow faithful disciples (over 30 strong) of our Sacred Scripture. Thanks to them we have attendances (on an average) of 70-150 parishioners at each of the various Advent, Lenten & special international speaker programs. These programs we hope have helped deepen our community's understanding of our Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture. Of course for those who wish to study & grow in their faith, without being a part of the ministries – we would encourage you to use the FORMED App which we have made available for free to all. This FORMED APP is considered the NETFLIX of catholic content and includes audio books, children's movies, lives of the saints to name but a few.

Our hope The number of people that attend mass on the weekends (approx. 2000) is just 12.5% of the those who professed to be catholic, or just 3% of all people within our Parish geography. We pray and hope that our larger gatherings on feast days & our other outward professions of faith - sends a message to all, that we are striving to be a faithful, united catholic community within Blacktown, where they should always feel welcomed. Our hope is also that of the 2000 that do attend weekends & the hundreds that attend daily mass, grow deeper in the understanding of our faith & in our own fellowship within the body of Christ. MQOF NINE (9) INVESTMENT PROPERTIES

- Net rental income generated for FY 2022 2023 was \$ 129,688 compared to \$135,643 in FY 2021-2022
- 8 were leased as at the close of 30 June 2023, one tenant provides disability services.
- Maintenance cost of these properties continues to be an issue due to the age of the buildings.

UPDATE ON ST PATRICK'S CHURCH (SPC) ROOF ISSUE and Raise the Roof Appeal (RRA)

- Despite a previous view to not take this option (by the committee) the Diocese are steering us towards resolving our roofing issue through the laying of a new membrane over the existing roof and through improving the guttering and downpipes (as they have not ruled out the plan for a new Cathedral to be built in Blacktown in the future.
- Funds raised through the 'RRA' amount to \$79,197 as at 30/06/23. Refer to the bulletin for the latest figure.
- Thanks to Jun Rule, Ray Francica and Charbelle Aboumelhem for their assistance on the Roof Sub- committee.
- Please refer to the 'Church Maintenance Update' section of the bulletin each week for the latest news on this matter. We will keep you updated via this channel as things progress.

OUR TOP 4 PRESSING NEEDS/FINANCIAL ISSUES

- The SPC church roof continues to be our number one issue. We will ultimately need to borrow the expected shortfall between what we have raised and what we will need to fund this major maintenance work.
- Our car parks continue to be things we need to keep an eye on with regards to upkeep and safety.
- Entrance doors at SPC may need replacing eventually (last quote was \$35,930).
- High plumbing maintenance cost on both churches clearing of piping blockages.

FINANCIAL YEAR 2022-2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- We helped send ten (10) pilgrims to WYD 2023 in Madrid (at a net cost to the parish of approx \$21k after allowing for funds that were raised through the efforts of our youth).
- The 'Collections Appeal' made by Michael at all Masses on 6-7 May saw a modest increase in giving.
- Received a total of \$7,000 Government Volunteers Grants which were used to purchase 3 laptops for office use.
- Sales through our Piety Stores have contributed \$12k net to our parish. Thank you to those involved in this Ministry.
- The Parish Audit for 2023 was completed and gave our financial administration a tick of approval.
- Parish Movie Nights at Hoyts Blacktown have been a major success, raising \$6k towards WYD23.
- We donated \$5K to our sister Parish St Anthony de Padua, Nissan Island, Bougainville, PNG.
- We refurbished the Sanctuary of both our churches and the new SPC Sacristy

What are three things you can do to be ready for Jesus during this second week of Advent? John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus by telling people to turn back to God and baptising them. He wore clothes made from camel's hair and wore a leather strap around his waist. For food he ate grasshoppers and wild honey. Draw a picture of John baptising someone in the Jordan River.

2nd Sunday of Advent Year B



Mt 1:1-8

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord. make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

This week's gospel captures beautifully the spirit of preparation and waiting that characterises the liturgical season of Advent. John the Baptist is portrayed as fulfilling the prophecies of Isaiah and others as the one who comes before the Lord preparing the way. He is a messenger, sent by God to 'do the groundwork' preparing the people for the coming of the Christ. Although this passage is used during Advent as preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus, we know that John was a contemporary (indeed cousin) of Jesus and the time of preparation was immediately prior to Jesus' public ministry.

John appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism for forgiveness of sins. It may seem odd to think of going to the wilderness to try to influence people. Today we might think that the city centre or street corner might be the better venue to preach something. What is it about the wilderness? Reference is made to the wilderness several times in scripture. It is used as a place of preparation and encounter with God. The wilderness referred to was a vast expanse of emptiness on the eastern side of the Jordan River. It was not uncommon for wandering preachers like John and Jesus to go out into the wilderness as a way of making a break from their previous life and getting themselves ready in body and spirit to begin their ministry. The wilderness to the east of the Jordan was also the place in which many of the rebels based themselves. There was a sense that challenge and unrest came out of the wilderness. In many ways that is what Jesus - heralded by John - brought out of the wilderness as well.

Historica

A Baptism of Forgiveness

The understanding that we generally have of baptism today has not always been the case. At the time of John and Jesus, the Jewish tradition used baptism as a ritual bath to cleanse a person who had become ritually unclean and make them able to participate in religious rituals. What John was preaching was a baptism for the forgiveness of sins – a new interpretation at the time. He emphasised that repentance was essential for forgiveness and that there needed to be a conscious returning to God. John's baptism was a symbolic act to signify the willingness of the person to renounce their sins and make a more conscious return to God.

The gospel of Mark is sometimes portrayed as a 'no fuss' gospel. Nowhere is this more clearly seen than in this week's passage. We have the first eight verses of the gospel and the author wastes no time in announcing the purpose, 'The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.' The gospel of Mark does not give any infancy narrative or genealogy like Matthew or Luke, nor a theological foreword like John. It jumps straight in with a declaration that Jesus is the Son of God and almost immediately begins to explore his ministry.

- Why would John have gone out into the wilderness to conduct his ministry?
- What do you think people found attractive about John's baptism of forgiveness?
- Why is the first sentence of the passage significant, given it is the very first sentence of the gospel of Mark?
- What would followers of John have thought about his prediction of someone coming after him?
- How can we continue to prepare the way for the Lord?






