REJOJCE

Gaudete Sunday anticipates the joy of the celebration of Christmas. readings guide us to capture that joy within our heart as we enter the final phase of Advent by reminding us that Jesus is the source of joy. We rejoice because God has come into the world to destroy death and open the gates of heaven.

The liturgical Readings opens up with Isaiah recalling the Year of Jubilee when God visited to heal and restore His people by reestablishing peace and justice. On the other hand, St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians has given instructions how to prepare for the coming of the Lord with Joy and Faithfulness by figuring out three basic spiritual principles:

Doing God's Will- this is our vocation to live out faithfulness to God in all circumstances in life

Do Good and avoid Evil- this rule would spare us from Satan and bring us to allegiance to what is good

Holiness of Life- one must be blameless before God in spirit, soul and body.

The Gospel spells out the Role of John the Baptist in the life of Jesus. John is the voice in the wilderness calling each one of us to make straight the path of the Lord. Baptizing with water, he calls our attention to cleanse ourselves from sins and iniquities by coming into repentance and conversion. Yet, as a witness to the Light who is Jesus, he had never been presumptuous but with humility he declared, "I am not the Messiah." John's baptism of water brings us repentance while Jesus' baptism of holy spirit brings us discipleship. Our witness to Christian Life is not fully defined by just becoming repentant sinners but by being true disciples of Jesus. While remission of sins is a key to salvation, it is in our participation in the mission of Jesus to build God's Kingdom that fulness of salvation may come.

There is indeed so much to rejoice as we continue reflecting on the saving works of God. He has come to save us. A revelation that has been fully realized in Jesus which we have responded with faith by becoming Jesus' witnesses in authentic discipleship.



THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT ~ YR B

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PHILIPPIANS 4:4-5

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice.

Indeed, the Lord is near.

GOSPEL: JOHN 1:6-8. 19-28

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 15: Liturgy & Language

A frequent question, especially in light of the translation of the third edition of the Roman Missal, concerns the language of the Mass.

Why do the words of Mass sound so different from the language we use in everyday life?

Human beings express spiritual realities through cultural language, gestures and actions.

Thus the Catechism teaches that one source for understanding Mass is found in human culture.

Every culture has its own language. Every language develops within the context of a particular culture. Eskimo culture, for example, uses many different words for "snow". French culture has an entire vocabulary focused on wine and wine-making and another for bread and bread-making.

We know instinctively to use a particular kind of language that is suited to the circumstances or occasion: we speak to children one way, but use different linguistic registers when speaking to loved ones, friends, colleagues, or employers.

For God's word offers different facets according to the capacity of the listener, and the Lord has portrayed his message in many colors ...Be glad then that you are overwhelmed, and do not be saddened because he has overcome you. A thirsty man is happy when he is drinking, and he is not depressed because he cannot exhaust the spring."

"In human life, signs and symbols occupy and important place. As a being at once body and spirit, man expresses and perceives spiritual realities through physical signs and symbols. As a social being, man needs signs and symbols to communicate with others, through language, gestures, and actions. The same holds true for his relationship with God." (CCC), n°. 1146.
