A Model of a Christian Family

The Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph is a model of a Christian family. As we celebrate this Feast of the Holy Family, this Sunday's Mass is all about the family. Why? Because a child is a gift from God, and a family lives according to the will of God. So, the parents of Jesus, Mary and Joseph dedicated their family life to God. Today, the Scripture readings guide us through these stories of the family that highlight the faith, obedience, and blessings within the family.

In the Book of Genesis, we encounter the story of Abraham and Sarah. Despite their old age and human limitations, they trusted in God's promise of descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky. Their faith was steadfast, and God fulfilled His promise, granting them a child, Isaac, a testimony to the power of faith and God's faithfulness.

In Luke's Gospel, we hear the presentation of Jesus in the Temple. This is an event that makes the fulfillment of the Law. Mary and Joseph, in faith adhered to the Jewish customs, present Jesus to the Lord. Simeon and Anna, two devout individuals, recognise the child as the fulfillment of God's promises, a moment of affirmation for the Holy Family.

The parents of Jesus offered him all he needs as a man to grow properly with love and humility, care, and fidelity to God. Today, how many families are there imitating the Holy Family. Many children see hatred and disrespect in families, and God is not put at the centre of a family's life.

Through the readings of this Sunday, we are reminded that faith, obedience, and trust in God's plan are fundamental in the life of every family. The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph serves as a model for all families. The model of the Holy family is showing us the virtues of love, humility, obedience, and trust in God's providence.

In our families today, we are called to imitate in a special way the faithfulness of our grandparents in faith, Abraham, and Sarah. As the Psalm reminds us of God's creative power, we praise and thank Him for the wonders of His creation including the gift of family, the foundation of society where His blessings are manifested.

Let us take this Feast of the Holy Family as an opportunity to reflect on our own families. May we foster an environment of love, kindness, humility, understanding, and mutual support in each family. Let us hold strongly to faith as the foundation that strengthens our bonds in the family and leads us closer to God.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: LUKE 2:16

The shepherds went in haste, and found Mary and Joseph and the Infant lying in a manger.

FIRST READING: SIRACH 3:2-6. 12-14

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 104:1-6, 8-9. R. W.7.8

The Lord remembers his covenant for ever.

SECOND READING: COLOSSIANS 3:12-21

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: COLOSSIANS 3:15. 16

Alleluia, alleluia! May the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, and the fullness of his message live within you. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: LUKE 2:22-40

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord – observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord – and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons. Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God; and he said:

'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.'

As the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected – and a sword will pierce your own soul too – so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare.'

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem.

When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.
