Yesterday, the Church celebrated the annual World Day of the Sick which would normally be held on February 11th, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Our parish was privileged to host the Diocesan Mass including the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick in St Patrick's Church. The prophetic and saintly Pope instituted this custom in 1992. Pope St John Paul II consistently maintained a charism to walking closely with the sick and suffering, courageously standing against an emerging culture of death, which often saw the neglect and abandonment of the elderly and other vulnerable persons. His most profound statement of this would be his personal witness to the dignity of those who suffer, as the world observed his very public and slow decline, his struggle with Parkinsons and other ailments, in the final years of his reign.

Fittingly and coincidentally, our Gospel for this Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time recounts Christ's miraculous encounter with an unnamed leper. Due to the lethality and contagiousness of the disease, those who suffered from leprosy were considered unclean, quarantined from the community, and required to present themselves in an identifiable way; as our first reading says: "A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, unclean, unclean!". In a society devoid of sufficient medical technologies to manage such contagions, the prescriptions of Leviticus are understandable, however, amounted to a life of absolute misery and isolation for the diseased; traditionally understood as symbolising the prognosis of our sin.

Christ, imitated by our saintly pontiff, shows His compassion to the sick who reach out to him for healing, even touching and curing the leper. This would not be the only time Christ would touch suffering, which is not only accounted for in His numerous healings, but in taking it upon Himself in its ultimate form during His passion and death. This has proved to be a pillar of Christ's ministry, exercised in the Church's apostolic mission since her birth on the cross, canonized in her sacrament for the sick. As a privileged minister of this sacrament, I have often been heartened by those in their anguish who repeat the cry of the leper "if you want to...you can cure me". For some, they will experience physical healing, even if only short term, but for all, an opportunity is facilitated to receive the healing peace and consolation of Christ and His Church, frequently for both the sick and their loved ones.

Let us give thanks for those who emulate Christ the Doctor, not only in the realm of spiritual and pastoral care, but those Catholic doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and researchers who must sometimes weather turbulent moral complexities in modern medical ethics and practices, resolute in the truth that the ministry of the Church in accompanying the sick has much to contribute to the field of medicine.



ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 21: Bows in the Liturgy

SUMMARY

The liturgy is comprised not only of words and music, it also includes gestures. These, too, are sacramental signs because they show in a visible way the hidden devotion of our hearts. A bow signifies reverence or honor to persons of the symbols that represent these persons.

There are two types of bows in the Roman Rite. A simple bow of the head is made during the naming of the Persons of the Blessed Trinity, at the name of Jesus, at the naming of the Blessed Virgin, the saint of the day and even the patron saint. A simple bow of the head is made by the communicant before the reception of Holy Communion.

A profound bow, or a bow of the body is made by the priest on several occasions during Mass: in the preparation of the Offerings, in Eucharistic Prayer I, and sometimes in reverence to the altar.

A profound bow is made by the deacon, when asks the priest's blessing before reading the Gospel.

The profound bow is made by all the ministers and the assembly during the Creed when we say the words that recall Christ's incarnation.

We Catholics put into our bodies what we believe. The profound reverence for God, for Christ, for the mysteries we celebrate is manifest in our bodies whenever we bow.

The Roman Missal

A bow signifies reverence and honour shown to the persons themselves or to the signs that represent them. There are two kinds of bow: a bow of the head and a bow of the body.
