Tray for Healing of Broken Hearts

This Sunday we are continuing to encounter Jesus in his public ministry of the challenges of life. The Gospel of Mark tells us, Jesus left the Synagogue went to the house of Simon and Andrew. There, Simon's mother-in-law had fever, but Jesus went at once to her, took her by hand and helped her up. The fever left her right away. But Jesus' healing did not end there, people rushed to get his help of healing, because they know his true message of teaching and power.

Today's First Reading from the book of Job reminds us about his family view of life as a chain of pain and sufferings. Job has lost his children and animals. What did he do? Job said, his life had faced misery and troubled. When Job was lying in bed, he was asking when will the Sun rise, because he was feeling restless.

For us, maybe we need Job's story to remind us that there is much more to existence than the physical present and future. Job recognised that he would never have the answers to his problems. Job's answer was to pray for his healing of broken-heart. At last, Job put his trust in God.

In the Gospel, we read that many people suffer from different diseases such as leprosy, withered arm, paralysis, broken hearts, and many more. Jesus healed these diseases. Here, after healing Simon's mother-in-law, all the people of the town brought their sick relatives and friends to Jesus for healing. He healed diseases and cast out many evils. Then in the morning before dawn he went to pray to the Father to regain his divine nature and power of healing.

So, in February of 2024, what does this healing and prayer of Jesus have to do with us? To have faith. The message is clear, Jesus wants us to use his love and power to heal and make us whole. Where? In our homes and families, in our Churches rather than in the Synagogue, communities and neighbourhoods where he heals many people.

It is time to come to Jesus. We may think that we are happy and healthy, but we do not know that we are suffering eternally of any kind. As believers, we must reach out to the presence of God. If we reach to Jesus Christ like the disciples searching for him, his desires of working with power will reach our hearts. Jesus will give us his love, grace, peace, and guidance. Like Simon who invited Jesus to his mother-in-law's house, let us also invite him. Because we believe that if we make Jesus aware about our problems, he will be present with us. Let us pray and open our broken hearts to receive his grace and healing. Amen.



That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 20: The Meaning of Incense

SUMMARY

The Church herself tells us that incense is an expression of reverence and prayer. She prays along with Psalm 141: "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering." The Book of Revelation also gives an understanding of the use of incense, even in heaven: the incense is joined to the prayer of the saints around the throne of God. St. Paul goes even further to suggest that not only does incense represent prayer, it signifies also the Christian: "we are the aroma of Christ." (2 Corinthians 2:15) Incense is a sacramental sign that can be seen, smelled, and even heard.

The different levels of reverence indicate the way the incense is used at Mass. Three swings of the censor or thurible may be given to the Blessed Sacrament at the consecration and also to anything in the Mass that represents Christ: the priest, the people, the Book of Gospels, the Paschal Candle, the Cross. Two swings are reserved for images and relics of saints. A single swing is used when incensing around the altar. Incense may be used at five different times during Mass: the Entrance Procession, at the beginning of Mass to incense the cross and altar, at the Gospel, the Offertory, and during the Eucharistic Prayer at the elevation of the consecrated host and chalice. When we see the incense, let us think of our prayers rising to heaven, up to the throne of God. When we inhale its fragrance, let us remind ourselves that in this world we are to be the sweet odor of Christ. When incense is used at Mass, let us recall our participation in the heavenly liturgy described in the Book of Revelation.


