# They let them go

We have come to Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week, the holiest week in the Church's liturgical Calendar because it contains the central liturgies of the Easter Triduum.

But Palm Sunday is 'big' by itself. It begins with the reenactment of the triumphant entry into Jerusalem of Jesus and in the Gospel we have the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. In the one liturgy we make the journey of Holy Week, from Jesus' coming into Jerusalem to his arrest, suffering and death.

There are so many elements that could be highlighted for this Sunday, literally courses are run on these themes, books have been written. So I encourage you to take the time, if you can, to prayerfully read the Passion for yourselves. What jumps out at you, what is speaking to you, how does it make you feel, what is your response?

I would like to highlight a theme that has spoken to me. In the Gospel that is read at the beginning of Mass before the procession that reenacts the triumphant entry of Jesus and the crowds into Jerusalem, we are told that those who stood around let the disciples go with the colt after they told them what Jesus had to say.

"They let them go". In our world where so often we are told that if we see something we need to say something, the bystanders recognised the truth of what the disciples had to say and so allowed them to carry on. There could be many reasons why we are not able to let something go, but as we enter into Holy Week can we reflect on our motivations and recognise that at times we allow ourselves to be influenced not by truth and love but by human considerations.

In the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ there are other examples of how human considerations can have a greater influence than they should in our actions. In one example, we hear about a woman, anointing Jesus with expensive ointment, pure nard. People complained, for they thought, it would have been better to sell the ointment and give the money to the poor. It is hard to argue against this, except Jesus doesn't simply agree with those people complaining. For Jesus, she was doing for him what she could and that she would be remembered into the future. Truth and love invites us in this situation to recognise it can never be either or, but both and. In life, people and events have to be honoured, we cannot simply focus on the economic bottom line.

As we enter Holy Week may we strive to see the ways we are invited to 'let them go' in the service of truth and love.



What am I searching for as I approach Holy Week?

#### PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD ~ YEAR B

**ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:** cf John 12: 1, 12-13; Ps 23: 9-10

Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out:

Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy! O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

FIRST READING: Isaiah 50:4-7

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** PS 21:8-9. 17-20. 23-24. R. V.2

R ~ My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

**SECOND READING:** Philippians 2:6-11

**GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:** Philippians 2:8-9

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! Christ became obedient for us even to death dying on the cross. Therefore God raised him on high and gave him a name above all other names. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

**GOSPEL:** Mark 15:1-39

The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

First thing in the morning, the chief priests together with the elders and the scribes, in short the whole Sanhedrin, had their plan ready. They had Jesus bound and took him away and handed him over to Pilate.

Pilate questioned him, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' 'It is you who say it' he answered. And the chief priests brought many accusations against him. Pilate questioned him again, 'Have you no reply at all? See how many accusations they are bringing against you!' But to Pilate's amazement, Jesus made no further reply.

At festival time Pilate used to release a prisoner for them, anyone they asked for. Now a man called Barabbas was then in prison with the rioters who had committed murder during the uprising. When the crowd went up and began to ask Pilate the customary favour, Pilate answered them, 'Do you want me to release for you the king of the Jews?' For he realised it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed Jesus over. The chief priests, however, had incited the crowd to demand that he should release Barabbas for them instead. The Pilate spoke again. 'But in that case,' he said to them 'what am I to do with the man you call king of the Jews?' They shouted back, 'Crucify him!' 'Why?' Pilate asked them 'What harm has he done?' But they shouted all the louder, 'Crucify him!' So Pilate, anxious to placate the crowd, released Barabbas for them and, having ordered Jesus to be scourged, handed him over to be crucified.

The soldiers led him away to the inner part of the palace, that is, the Praetorium, and called the whole cohort together. They dressed him in purple, twisted some thorns into a crown and put it on him. And they began saluting him, 'Hail, king of the Jews!' They struck his head with a reed and spat on him; and they went down on their knees to do him homage. And when they had finished making fun of him, they took off the purple and dressed him in his own clothes.

They led him out to crucify him. They enlisted a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, father of Alexander and Rufus, who was coming in from the

#### Gospel (Cont.)

country, to carry his cross. They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, which means the place of the skull.

They offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he refused it. Then they crucified him, and shared out his clothing, casting lots to decide what each should get. It was the third hour when they crucified him. The inscription giving the charge against him read: 'The King of the Jews.' And they crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left.

The passers-by jeered at him; they shook their heads and said, 'Aha! So you would destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days! Then save yourself: come down from the cross!' The chief priests and the scribes mocked him among themselves in the same way. 'He saved others,' they said 'he cannot save himself. Let the Christ, the king of Israel, come down from the cross now, for us to see it and believe.' Even those who were crucified with him taunted him.

When the sixth hour came there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why have you deserted me?' When some of those who stood by heard this they said, 'Listen, he is calling on Elijah'. Someone ran and soaked a sponge in vinegar and, putting it on a reed, gave it him to drink saying, 'Wait and see if Elijah will come to take him down.' But Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.

All kneel and pause a moment.

And the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The centurion, who was standing in front of him, had seen how he had died, and he said, 'In truth this man was a son of God.'

# CHURCH MAINTENANCE UPDATE

## St Patrick's Church - Roof Project Update

Just recently, our roof consultants/auditors have submitted their detailed roof inspection reports which was then vetted by the head of the Property section of the Diocese of Parramatta, thanks to Julian Concato.

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said church. We will keep you posted....

As of 29/2/24, we have received the sum of \$198,845 from donations & insurance settlement.


