Living Water: Embracing Transformation Through Encounter.

On this Third Sunday of Lent the Liturgy begins the Rites of Scrutinies celebrated on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. The catechumens who are preparing to be baptised at Easter Vigil are known as "The Elect". The Rites of Scrutinies are celebrated by using the Scripture readings from Liturgical Year A. The Elect to be initiated at Easter have desired for new life in Jesus Christ.

This Sunday is the First Scrutiny, and the Gospel reading is a conversation between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well (John 4: 5-42). This is a fascinating story. Why? Because it is unusual for a Jew to speak to a Samaritan woman during Jesus' time, especially a woman who was a stranger. Jesus spoke to the woman of a "living water" that was able to quench thirst completely from her. She became a "spring of water rising up to eternal life" in her. Jesus showed her that he knew about her personal life. He revealed to her that the hour had come to worship the one true God in spirit and in truth. Jesus showed to her that he is the Messiah. The woman's faith grew. She spread the news, of the Gospel.

What is this story bringing to the life of the Elect and to all of us who are baptised? The story brings for us self-searching, repentance, and healing. As we heard in the First Reading, God gave Moses the Ten Commandments. They teach us how to live truly human lives full of meaning, purpose, and integrity. Jesus summarises it into one, the "Commandment of love." This is also teaching us how to live in a right relationship with God and with one another. Our baptism is the gateway of following Jesus' teaching. When we are baptised, our bodies become the Temple, a dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. We will live freely from materialism of being concern with selling and buying than loving God and our neighbour. As we heard in the Gospel (John 2: 13-25) of this third Sunday of Lent, we witness Jesus cleansing the Temple. Jesus cleanses us too.

Jesus entered the Temple in Jerusalem and encountered chaos and commercial activities. There were money changers and merchants in the Temple that profaning its sanctity. The Temple became more secular than expected, but Jesus overturned the tables and drove out those who were buying and selling, declaring, "Stop making my Father's house a marketplace." Jesus was not cleansing the Temple, but he was also replacing the law, not destroying it . As Jesus encountered the Samaritan woman, he is a new law. He speaks to her about living water, an image for the transformative power of God's grace and love.

Jesus is inviting all of us to come with our doubts, struggles, and imperfections. He meets us amid our brokenness and offers us living water, the source of true fulfilment and eternal life.

So, let the season of Lent be a time of transformation and renewal, especially when we are receiving our new members in the Church at the Easter. May we purify our hearts and draw closer to the Lord. Amen.





ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: CF PSALM 24:15-16

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

FIRST READING: EXODUS 20:1-17

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! God loved the world so much, he gave us his only Son, that all who believe in him might have eternal life. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

GOSPEL: John 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 24: The Creed

SUMMARY

A frequent question concerns the first pronoun of the Creed. Why do we say " I believe" rather that "we" believe?

Notice that one of the first tasks of the liturgical assembly is for the different members to be formed into a single body. The "I" (ie., the first person singular pronoun) of the Creed is, in a sense, the "I" of the singular Body of Christ, who worships God the Father. It is also the personal "I" of the individual believer. This "I believe" of the Creed is able to account for the personal belief and the corporate belief of Christ's mystical body. It is both a baptismal confession and a communal statement of shared faith.

The Letter of the Corinthians tells us that the body has many members, but it is one body.

The plural "we" signifies grammatically a collection of individuals, "we" is only a united body when it is understood as "I".

Credo, I believe, signifies at one and the same time, my personal faith and the faith of the one body, the Church.

The Roman Missal

Moreover, they are to form one body, whether in hearing the Word of God, or in taking part in the prayers and in the singing, or above all by the common offering of the Sacrifice and by participating together at the Lord's table. This unity is beautifully apparent from the gestured and bodily postures observed together by the faithful.

In the liturgy the sanctification of the man is signified by signs perceptible to the senses, and is effected in a way which corresponds with each of these signs; in the liturgy the whole public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, by the Head and . His members."



Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water caused Leaia a lot

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Leaia had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilt built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions. "We are very thankful and grateful for the water tank. It has helped us so much and made our daily life easier," Leaia said.



Just recently, our roof consultants/auditors have submitted their detailed roof inspection reports which was then vetted by the head of the Property section of the Diocese of Parramatta, thanks to Julian Concato.

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said church. We will keep you posted....

As of 29/2/24, we have received the sum of \$198,845 from donations & insurance settlement.
