Four Easy Ways to help you become a Saint in Five Easy Steps...

Last week we celebrated the Octave Day with Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy Sunday is most commonly associated with the plenary indulgences granted, inciting flocks of faithful to various Divine Mercy Devotions and to the confessional to obtain the indulgences attached. However, the Church offers a variety of ways to obtain indulgences easily obtainable throughout the year, many of which might already be part of your spiritual life. Over the course of the Easter Triduum, for example, most of you could have received three plenary indulgences: i. Recitation of the Tantum Ergo on Holy Thursday; ii. Devoutly assisting with the Veneration of the Cross, or making the way of the cross; iii. Renewing your baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil. All of us who attended the Paschal Triduum did this!

Indulgences have had a dubious history, most famously with Martin Luther's criticism due to an embarrassing short-term practice in some places of exchanging indulgences for material wealth and profit. For those not familiar with indulgences, they are granted by the Holy See (Rome) and are a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions. In other words, clearing the straight and narrow path to sainthood. You can receive one plenary indulgence a day AND even offer it for the faithful departed!

Here are your five steps: The normal conditions for a plenary indulgence are: a) The "work" of the indulgence (eg. half an hour of Adoration) while in a state of grace; b) detached from all sin, venial and mortal; c) pray for the intention of the Holy Father (normally an Our Father and Hail Mary); within 20 days before or after; d) go to confession; and e) receive Holy Communion. The catch is you must have the intention of obtaining the plenary indulgence to gain it- so no back tracking if you accidentally did an indulgence work! One confession will suffice for multiple indulgences, but reception of the Holy Eucharist and prayer intentions for the Holy Father must be applied for each work.

Here are the four easy "works" for a plenary indulgence that you can do every day:

1. Half an Hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (we have a Blessed Sacrament Chapel).
2. Praying the Rosary in a church, oratory, with your family or other gathering; or reciting with the Holy Father as it is broadcasted live. (We do this in our parish before or after every weekday Mass!)
3. Meditating on the Holy Scriptures for half an hour.
4. Praying the stations of the cross "legitimately erected" (like the ones in our churches and almost any Catholic church).

Beside these, there are indulgences granted throughout the year (such as praying the "Te Deum" on New Years Eve, or the "Veni Creator Spiritus" on New Years Day). Additionally the Holy Father provides extraordinary opportunities, such as the ones granted during the COVID-19 pandemic or in the Year of Mercy.

But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 28: The Mystery of Faith

SUMMARY

During Mass, immediately after the consecration of the Bread and Wine, the priest, with the Eucharist on the altar in front of him says, "The mystery of faith." Why is this done? What does it mean?

Mysterium fidei was at one time translated as "Let us proclaim the mystery of faith." And yet, the Latin text does not mean that we should "do" anything. It is simply a statement of fact, a statement about what is present before the priest on the altar.

In order to understand this, we must consider closely the directions given by the *Roman Missal*. The priest says his part, then remains silent. The people, the Missal says, continue by acclaiming one of the formulas. Why does the priest not join the people? To appreciate this, we must understand that the meaning of the root word of mystery, "*muo*," literally means "to shut the mouth." "*Muo*" is also the root word of the English cognate "mute." It carries with it the nuance of being dumbfounded. Mystery, then, has the notion of being silent or being rendered speechless when confronted by the awesome majesty of God.

Imagine yourself at Mass, the consecration has just occurred. The priest stands from his genuflection. And it is as if he recognizes that before him, on the altar is the Body and Blood of Christ! The mystery of faith! And being so overwhelmed by this miracle, he is rendered speechless. The people rush to his help and conclude the acclamation.

This is a marvellous combination of people and priest working together in celebration of the Mass. It is a perfect example of how a deeper understanding of the different parts of the Mass can lead to a fuller and more intelligent participation. This deeper internal participation nurtures the spiritual life of both priest and people.

The Roman Missal

After the Consecration when the Priest has said, The mystery of faith, the people pronounce the acclamation, using one of the prescribed formulas.

General Instruction, n. 151

IN THE TRADITION

The Church, therefore, earnestly desires that Christ's faithful, when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators; on the contrary, through a good understanding of the rites and prayers they should take part in the sacred action conscious of what they are doing, with devotion and full collaboration. They should be instructed by God's word and be nourish at the table of the Lord's body; they should give thanks to God; by offering the Immaculate Victim, not only through the hands of the priest, but also with him, they should learn also to offer themselves; through Christ the Mediator, they should be drawn day by day into ever more perfect union with God and with each other, so that finally God may be all in all."

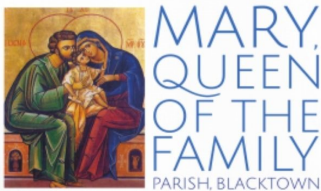

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to
roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce
Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the
preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will
soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish
Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said
church. We will keep you posted....

As of 29/2/24, we have received the sum of \$198,845 from donations &
insurance settlement.

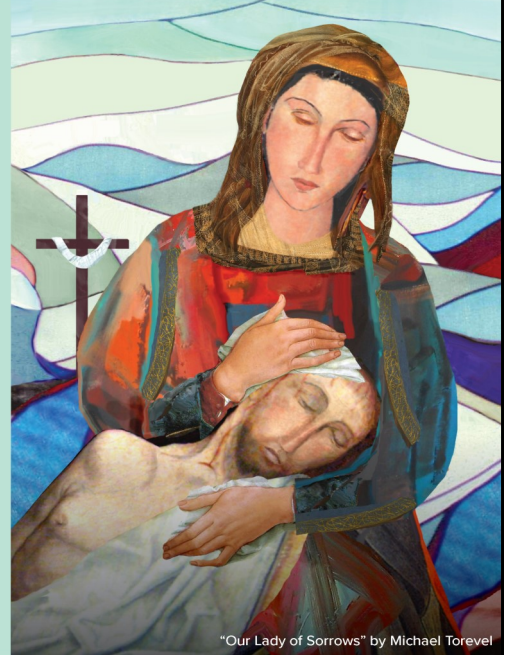
