ONE FOLD, ONE SHEPHERD

The fourth Sunday of Easter presents Jesus as the Risen Christ who is present with His people as the Good Shepherd. When Jesus revealed Himself, "I am the Good Shepherd," He taught His disciples that He would always be with them in this world and in the world to come. No one can take us out of Jesus' care for we have been entrusted to Him by the Father. Jesus said, "those who have been given to me by my Father would never be lost," He is different from any hired hand who would just abandon the sheep in the midst of wolves.

Keeping our faith in Jesus, we now identify ourselves as His sheep and He is our shepherd. "One Fold, One Shepherd" has become our vision that would sustain our journey in this world and a destiny in the world to come as we may hopefully be one into His kingdom.

The liturgical readings have provided us insights on how we could grow in our relationship with Jesus that would become assurances of His presence.

Firstly, Intimacy with Jesus. This is intimacy that is founded on mutual recognition. Jesus knows His sheep, "I know my own." In turn, we must recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd by listening to Jesus in scriptures and in prayer.

Secondly, Discipleship to Jesus. A Discipleship that is seen in our enduring fidelity to Him. Faith is our response to Jesus' revelation as the Good Shepherd. As our discipleship begins in faith, it must endure forever until the end. Fidelity to Jesus must compel us to imitate Himjust as He freely laid down His life, can we not do something good not because we do not have the choice but because it is the right thing to do.

Lastly, witnessing to Jesus. We must be willing participants in the Mystery of Christ. It must be a conscious and deliberate participation in the work of evangelization by opposing the diabolic work of the devil to scatter and destroy humanity. This is the real ministry that every disciple is called to heal and reconcile where the devil has wounded and divided because the hand of God holds us, we are God's loving and healing hand extended into the world today.

Jesus, the Good Shepherd, promises abundant life, we may continue our journey bearing His presence in this world and we may come forward to attain together the bountiful life of His glory in the world to come.

GOSPEL: John 10:11-18

Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep.

I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep.

And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well.

They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd.

The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia.

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 29: Bow before Holy Communion

SUMMARY

People often ask, "What is the proper gesture before receiving Holy Communion?" The answer is actually very clear and simple. It can be found in the General Instruction of *The Roman Missal* at paragraph 160. The communicant makes a bow of the head before receiving the Body of the Lord and before receiving the Precious Blood.

This causes difficulty for some people because one might consider that a more proper, a more appropriate gesture or even a more reverent gesture would be a genuflection. That may indeed be true: a genuflection can be a beautiful sign of reverence. On the other hand, that is not what the Church has asked us to do.

Instead, the Church has chosen a gesture that everyone is able to do. This is based on the Church's understanding that in the celebration of Mass, we should manifest in our bodies the great unity that we share in Christ: we are members of his body.

A bow could be more reverent, but in this instance of preparation for Holy Communion, the Church herself decides what we are to do. Let us follow the prescribed gesture, the bow of the head, in obedience to the Church. What's more, make the bow of the head mean a genuflection in your heart. God will see your reverence and your neighbour will see your obedience.

The Roman Missal

When receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence and receives the Body of the Lord from the minister. The consecrated host may be received either on the tongue or in the hand, at the discretion of each communicant. When Holy Communion is received under both kinds, the sign of reverence is also made before receiving the Precious Blood.







CHURCH MAINTENANCE UPDATE

St Patrick's Church - Roof Project Update

Just recently, our roof consultants/auditors have submitted their detailed roof inspection reports which was then vetted by the head of the Property section of the Diocese of Parramatta, thanks to Julian Concato.

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said church. We will keep you posted....

As of 29/2/24, we have received the sum of \$198,845 from donations & insurance settlement.


