# I am the vine, you are the branches

The Gospel for this Fifth Sunday in Easter comes from John's Gospel and is the famous passage from chapter 15, the vine and the branches.

Jesus tells us that the Father, the vinedresser prunes the vine, getting rid of branches that produce no fruit but prunes those who do produce, so that they can produce even more fruit. We are pruned by means of the word, spoken by Jesus and through making our home in him, just as he makes his in us. How readily do we allow ourselves to be challenged by the Scriptures? I am sure we have our favourite passages but do we allow ourselves to be open to each and every passage or only those that make us feel good?

There are lists and applications that allow us to read the Bible in a year. This is a good ambition but what I am talking about is more than a New Year's Resolution. It requires us to be open to God's Word on a regular basis, with the basic question in mind, of what is God saying to me in this passage?

While pruning is important to bear fruit, what is even more critical is to remain as part of the vine in the first place. Several times in our Gospel Jesus talks about the need to "remain" as part of the vine, as part of Jesus. We are being invited to remain in the Church. I am sure we all know of people who have stopped attending Church, even perhaps members of our own families. Each person has their own story of why they stop, but I do believe that the Church needs to do better at articulating what we believe in and not just what we are opposed to.

There are many reasons to 'remain' as part of the Church, but fundamentally we are being invited to see how our relationship with God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit becomes our source of strength and grace to allow our lives may bear much fruit. We are nourished for our faith journey by the Scriptures, the Eucharist and the prayers and support of the community. The command Jesus gives to love, invites us to love to the full. This is especially the case when things go wrong in the liturgy. This is not an excuse to be shoddy or for a lack of preparation but is there a more powerful statement of love, than to love a baby who is crying in the middle of the homily or the Eucharistic Prayer?

Our faith cannot just be expressed when things are going well or are easy, but our faith is even more important when things are less than ideal. For when we are weak, God is strong.

May we know how we are nourished to bear fruit and to continue to remain as part of the Church.

# **ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS**

## **Episode 30: The Liturgical Movement**

#### SUMMARY

In essence, the liturgical movement is the effort on the part of the Church help the faithful participate better at Mass. This meant, initially, that the people would participate in the singing and giving the responses. Over the course of time, the Church realized that it is important that the people be able to enter deeply into the mystery by understanding what's going on during Mass. This means especially that they consciously participate in the offering. The liturgical movement helped to foster this kind of participation. In the 1920s, a Benedictine monk, Virgil Michel, return to America from his studies in Europe with some magnificent insights about the richness of the liturgy and the ability of the faithful to participate. One of the fundamental ideas he shared with the American Church was that prayer in the church must be connected with action in the world. With Dorothy Day, the founder of the Catholic Worker Movement, Virgil Michel showed Catholics how prayer and concern for the poor should be woven together. Pope Pius XII echoes this notion in Mediator Dei when he insists, "it is fitting that the minds believes what the lips sing, and that what the mind believes should be practiced in public and private life," (n.153). The Liturgical movement is indeed a movement—but it is not fundamentally about changing the liturgy, rather the liturgy is intended to change us: to make us more aware, more receptive to the treasures of Church's public prayer. "The Liturgical Movement, therefore, as the words indicate, is a movement- a movement towards the *liturgy*". It is the effort to being the people themselves closer to the liturgy, to understand fully, to enter into it more deeply, and to participate and benefit from it more completely. The Liturgical Movement is the effort to help the people participate better in the Mass: fully, consciously, and actively.







#### St Patrick's Church - Roof Project Update

Just recently, our roof consultants/auditors have submitted their detailed roof inspection reports which was then vetted by the head of the Property section of the Diocese of Parramatta, thanks to Julian Concato.

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said church. We will keep you posted....

As of 29/2/24, we have received the sum of \$198,845 from donations & insurance settlement.




