God's Mercy Endures Forever

This Second Sunday of Easter is the celebration of the Divine Mercy Sunday. The Church is asking us to celebrate and appreciate the mercy of God because we feel unfaithful to God. We have turned our backs to God and have failed Him so many times. God does not condemn us, nor is he angry with us. He is a God of mercy that endures forever.

Today the Acts of the Apostles tells us that the early Christian community lived lives of communion. Their lives were filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit brings them new life of the Church. They bore witnesses to the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. They were united to help their members who were in need. No member claimed any possessions as his or her own but shared everything in their community of believers. They practiced love, compassion, and mercy. They witnessed the presence of Risen Lord in their hearts. They pray and break bread together, holding one heart and one mind out of love.

In the Gospel, John tells us that the disciples were hiding in the room for fear of the Jewish leaders. Suddenly, Jesus stood among them and said, "Peace." Peace be with them in their troubled and wounded hearts. Jesus has forgiven them for the betrayal, denial, deserting and running away from him. Jesus expresses his love for them, and they must do the same to forgive others. Jesus said, "For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained." Here, Jesus establishes the Sacrament of reconciliation, the great source of God's mercy within the Church. He has offered God's mercy and forgiveness for free to the disciples and to us. Jesus breathed on them, and they received the Holy Spirit to guide their lives and heal divisions.

So, the message of God's mercy needs to be proclaimed and understood because we are losing the sight of the presence of God. In our world, we are losing the sense of sin, where the value and sacredness of human life is not anymore acknowledged. We think more of material things that become the norm of success, where God is pushed away. It is not true, we need God's mercy and His grace to reform our lives and walk along the way of conversion and salvation.

And how wonderful it is to realize that God looks at each one of us with love and mercy. Disciple Thomas refused to believe unless he has a personal experience of the Lord. Is it so? No! We do not need to worry that we cannot find God. He finds us. We should not be afraid that we cannot see God. He sees us all the time. We should not be sad that we cannot love God enough. He loves us unconditionally with a heart so full of mercy. Amen.







ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: 1 PETER 2:2

Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk, that in him you may grow to salvation, alleluia.

Alleluia, alleluia! You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; happy are those who have not seen me, but still believe! Alleluia!

GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.' 'As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 27: My Sacrifice and Yours

SUMMARY

At the end of the Preparation of the Offerings, the priest says to the people: "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours (*meum ac vestrum sacrificium*) may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father." There are not two sacrifices. Rather, we share in the singular sacrifice of Christ, each in a unique way.

The *Roman Missal* makes clear that the people offer the sacrifice together with the priest. The people participation in the offering is sacramentalized by the offertory procession in which the people present not only bread and wine, but what these gifts symbolise: the offering of themselves. The priest then takes these gifts to the altar and presents them to God at the place of total self-giving, the altar of sacrifice. The gift of the people is joined to that of the priest and together joined to the eternal offering of Christ, thus highlighting the common priesthood of the Faithful, who are enabled by virtue of baptism to offer prayer and sacrifice.

This offering of priest and people occurs first and fundamentally in the heart. It is the total giving of oneself to God in union with Christ.

The Roman Missal

In the celebration of Mass the faithful form a holy people, a people of God's own possession and a royal Priesthood, so that they may give thanks to God and offer the unblemished sacrificial Victim not only by means of the hands of the Priest but also together with him and so that they may learn to offer their very selves.

General Instruction, n° . 95

It is desirable that the participation of the faithful be expressed by an offering, whether of bread and wine for the celebration of the Eucharist or of other gifts to relieve the needs of the Church and of the poor.





CHURCH MAINTENANCE UPDATE

St Patrick's Church - Roof Project Update

Just recently, our roof consultants/auditors have submitted their detailed roof inspection reports which was then vetted by the head of the Property section of the Diocese of Parramatta, thanks to Julian Concato.

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said church. We will keep you posted....

As of 29/2/24, we have received the sum of \$198,845 from donations & insurance settlement.
