God's Love is Unconditional

This Sunday is the Sixth Sunday of Easter. The readings present to us God's unconditional and inclusive love, through the transformative power of the Holy Spirit, and the call to embrace one another with love and compassion.

In the first reading, the Acts of the Apostles tells us about God's plan to bring salvation to all people, regardless of their background. We hear the profound encounter between Peter and Cornelius, a Roman centurion, and a Gentile, who welcomes Peter with reverence and humility. Cornelius has recognised Peter as God's messenger, and all those in the house were baptised. From Peter and Cornelius' conversation, we can see at least three things about the kind of acceptance God has given to his household: universal acceptance, no discrimination and God does not play favourites. This encounter challenges us to see beyond societal barriers and embrace one another as brothers and sisters in Christ. Just as God shows no partiality, so too are we called to welcome all people with open arms, recognising the inherent dignity and worth of everyone.

In the First Letter of St John, we are reminded that love is the essence of God's nature and the foundation of our relationship with Him. God's love is revealed to us through the sending of His Son Jesus Christ, as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. As recipients of this love, we are called to love one another, for love is from God and whoever loves knows God.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus commands His disciples to abide in His love and to love one another as He has loved them. He emphasizes the sacrificial nature of love, laying down one's life for friends. Jesus declares that His disciples are no longer servants but friends, chosen and appointed to bear fruit that will last. This passage underscores the depth and breadth of God's love for us and calls us to extend that unconditional love to others.

What is this unconditional love of God telling us today? To strive to welcome and embrace all people with the same love and acceptance God extends to us, regardless of differences. This love is relational to each other, in such a way that we are called to cultivate a spirit of humility and reverence in our interactions with others. We are called to be witnesses and recognise the dignity and worth of each other as a beloved child of God.

May the Holy Spirit guide us in our efforts to love one another as Christ has loved us, so that we may be beacons of light and love in a world that is often divided and broken. May we be inspired by the example of Jesus Christ, who laid down his life for us. And may his love compel us to do likewise for others. Amen.

ELEMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC MASS

Episode 31: The Dismissal

SUMMARY

We might consider that the words of the dismissal are the three (*Ite, missa est*) most forgotten words of the entire Mass. The Latin word, "Ite" is the imperative of "go". This is an emphatic, insistent **Go!** "*Ite, missa est*" literally means "Go. it is sent."

Mass was originally a series of dismissals: the dismissal of those in the Order of Penitents, the dismissal of those in the Order of Catechumen, and finally, at the end of Mass, the dismissal of the members of the community of the Faithful.

The Church herself teaches what we are to do at the dismissal of the Mass: we must return to doing good works, and praising and blessing God.

The new edition of the Roman Missal provides four options for the dismissal:

- 1) Go forth, the Mass is ended;
- 2) Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord
- 3) Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life;
- 4) Go in peace.

The second and third dismissals were added to the Roman Missal by Pope Benedict XVI in response to the 2008 Synod on the Word of God in the Life and Mission of the Church. The Holy Father added these biblical dismissals so that the connection between liturgy and daily life would be more evident. The first of these comes from the story of the healing of the demoniac in the Gospel of Saint Mark. The other comes from the fifth chapter of Saint Luke which describes the healing of the paralytic. He went home glorifying God! We are reminded at the conclusion of every Mass that the mission of the Catholic Faithful is precisely to bring the message of the Gospel to their families, to their neighbourhoods and to the workplace.

Roman Missal

The celebration of Mass, as the action of Christ and of the People of God arrayed hierarchically, is the centre of the whole of Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful individually. For in it is found the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit.

THE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH

The faithful... carry out their own part the mission of the whole Christian people in the Church and in the world... They live in the world, that is, in each and in all of the secular professions and occupations. They live in the ordinary circumstances of family and social life, from which the very web of their existence is woven. They are called there by God that by exercising their proper function and led by the spirit of the Gospel they may work for the sanctification of the world from within as a leaven. In this way they may make Christ known to others, especially by the testimony of a life resplendent in faith, hope and charity.





CHURCH MAINTENANCE UPDATE

St Patrick's Church - Roof Project Update

Just recently, our roof consultants/auditors have submitted their detailed roof inspection reports which was then vetted by the head of the Property section of the Diocese of Parramatta, thanks to Julian Concato.

We are now at the stage of preparing a Scope of Work to be distributed to roofing tradesmen and builders for their costing. We are grateful to Bruce Moa, an architect/builder who volunteered to assist our parish in the preparation of the scope of work, checking of plans, compliances and will soon manage the project. Bruce is a parishioner of Mary Immaculate parish Quakers Hill and is project managing the current renovation of the said church. We will keep you posted....

As of 28/4/24, we have received the sum of \$200,045 from donations & insurance settlement.




