First Sunday of Advent

"It will seem as though all hell has broken loose - sun, moon stars, earth, sea, all in an uproar, and everyone all over the world in a panic at what is coming...When these things start to happen, stand tall, for your deliverance is near at hand." Luke 21, 28-28; 34-36

Getting towards the end of Luke's Gospel, the writer ventures into an imaginative and hypothetical description of Christ's Second Coming. Since he has no inside knowledge of what that will look like, he relies on the kind of language we associate with poetry metaphor, symbolism and hyperbole. Because his topic is the end of the world as we know it, we call it apocalyptic writing. It is closer in style to poetry than to prose.

Poetry is destroyed when we undertake a word by word or line by line analysis of the text. We get a better appreciation by allowing the words to wash over us. In that way we get a feel for what the author is describing. In today's gospel-reading Luke offers a poetic description of how the world and, indeed, the universe will be disjointed at the time of the Second Coming of Jesus.

We are used to dealing with signs and symptoms which are pointers to various aspects of our daily living. A flashing red or blue light frequently points to a hazard ahead on a road or a police operation in progress. When we present ourselves to a doctor for examination, we describe the signs that something is amiss in our bodily functions. We can even begin to panic as we await the doctor's interpretation and assessment of those signs in the light of his or her professional experience. The signs of the end times that Luke names are frightening. Paradoxically, however, they are the signs of the arrival of the fullness of love in the person of Jesus, who knows fully the human condition and the ups and downs that are part of it. But, if we are going to be able to stand secure in the presence of the Son of Man when he returns, we must surely be alert to the signs of chaos, destruction, injustice and inequity present in our contemporary world, and take responsible, gospel action.

Today's gospel-reading parallels our recent Sunday readings from Mark. Following Mark, Luke's description of the upheaval and chaos in the natural world, comes immediately after the story of the widow's mite. In explaining the action of the widow giving her all, Jesus describes the inequality and disparity of a religious system which forces people like the widow into penury. He then moves the focus onto the Temple practices that cause the disparity and points out that, in time, the Temple and the system that supports it will be destroyed totally. The magnificent Temple edifice will prove to be as ephemeral as the new leaves, flowers and fruit on the fig tree.

The relevance of all this for us in the here and now is that the upheaval Jesus describes as a prelude to the coming of the Son of Man is really an invitation for us to look at our world and notice the signs of upheaval that leave us less than comfortable. The world of commerce is intent on lulling us into a sense of false security. The shopping malls are decorated already with tinsel and gaudy adverts for bargain-priced presents. And have carols echoing through all the shops, forcing us to think that Christmas has arrived already. Yet there are still vast gaps between the poor and the rich; the homeless seek shelter for the night on the doorsteps of the shopping malls; migrant families are locked away in detention centres because they lack the right documentation; the Covid pandemic is still causing havoc around the globe; refugees are pleading for welcome at the borders of wealthy countries, whose citizens are deaf to cries for assistance. We live in a world that is seriously disjointed and on a planet that has been desecrated because of human selfishness and neglect. Yet the retail industry tries to massage our senses and our minds into believing that our world is full of peace and good-will.

But over the next few weeks, Advent intervenes to shake us out of the lethargy that has numbed us into insensitivity. Hidden in the signs of disintegration, upheaval and chaos are signs of God's ever-present love. To see them, however, we have to make time to look, to discover and to ponder. This first Sunday of Advent is an invitation to us to stop and take in the many signs of God's love hidden in the ordinary upsets of our lives, in the babbling and disagreements of our political leaders, in the Covid pandemic that has blown away our notions of normality and distanced us from those we love.

Traditionally, we take the Advent season as a time of preparation for the coming of Jesus into our lives. If we are to allow Jesus to be born in our hearts, we can expect that he will nudge us to involve ourselves in changing what is crying out for change and conversion, not just in ourselves, but in our world. He is calling us to set to work to establish the kingdom of God where we live and work and socialise. That involves treating one another, especially those who are so often overlooked, with justice, respect, care and compassion. In a very real sense, Advent telescopes our lives into four weeks of searching, noticing, reflecting, and taking constructive Gospel action. And isn't that the purpose of our lives? Are we not on a life's journey to come into the presence of the one who loves us endlessly. His love is so boundless that the prospect of coming before him when our earthly lives come to an end must fill us with hope. For then our pretences and self-justification will evaporate, and we will rest secure with the one who loved us into life and who loves us in our strength and weakness, in our failures and our triumphs.







PARISH PLANNING DAY FOR 2025

About 32 members of the MQOF parish community, including members of the Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Committee and Frs Wim, Andrew, Ever and Deacon John, gathered on Saturday 16 November in the St Pat's MPA for the Parish Planning Day for 2025.

The day started with the 9am Mass and after a presentation by Fr Wim on the theme "Go make disciples", Fr Rooney led the group in discernment about mission. We were reminded that "We are mission, we are the hands and feet of Jesus, called to build up the Kingdom of God".

There was sharing about how each saw their mission: the need to know the people in the parish was noted by many, to bring people into the Church, building up relationships and meeting people where they are at; say hallo to people, and reaching out and reaching in.


The afternoon session focused on feedback on what was happening and a wish list, amongst which were: children's liturgy in both communities; need a welcome pack; reply to enquiries, promote the programs symbolon and FORMED; review how collections are taken up; how do we bring people, especially young people, back into the community; ALPHA program; opportunities to connect with parents during the sacramental programs; build up community by holding community events; how can we build up our current groups e.g. Legion of Mary, and how can we get those who are attending Mass already actively involved in liturgical and outreach ministries.

^{*} Parramatta Catholic Foundation (PCF) – The Diocese reduced this debt for all parishes during this year by changing the way the quota is calculated, both now and going forward. Candle money from both our churches is used by us to reduce this debt, so thank you to everyone who purchases these.

MQOF INVESTMENT PROPERTIES – 9 properties owned in total

- Net rental income generated for the 2023 / 2024 F/YR was \$197,776 as compared to \$129,688 in the 2022 / 2023 F/YR.
- All our investment properties were leased as of the close of business on 30 June 2024.
- The Syro-Malabar community are paying \$1,200 per month to use SMC and a further \$200 a month for use of the garage.
- The cost of maintaining these properties continues to be an issue for us due to the age of the buildings. A total of \$35K was outlaid on maintenance works on our properties over the year, including \$6k on the property at 151 Reservoir Rd.

UPDATE ON THE ST PATRICK'S CHURCH (SPC) ROOF ISSUE and our 'Raise the Roof Appeal' (RRA)

- Resolving the SPC roof issue has taken us much longer than we would have hoped, due to several issues and delays that have arisen along the way. But we are now pleased to announce that the tender to fix the roof has recently been awarded to GS Design + Construct at a cost of \$506,605*. To this end, we have applied to the Diocese to spend up to \$600,000, if needed, and to borrow \$500,000 over the maximum repayment term available to us. Our application to spend needs to be considered by the Diocesan Property Council, the Diocesan Finance Committee and the College of Consultors. Owing to the Christmas holidays and the timing of the various meetings it may be early February before we receive approval to proceed. Accordingly, we can't do anything until the approval is given but, we plan to get things moving as soon as that is sought.
 - * This amount is subject to change due to the delay in locking in a start date in late 2024.
- Funds raised through the 'Raise the Roof Appeal' amounted to \$211,153 as of 30 June 2024 (which includes \$85k from an insurance claim). This appeal has now been withdrawn and all donations made to the parish by means of the Second Collection and Planned Giving etc will now go to meet the development and maintenance needs of the parish, which will of course, include repayments to the Diocese for our loan in the future.
- Thanks go to Ray Francica and Charbelle Aboumelhem for their continued assistance on the Roof Sub-Committee and to Bruce Moa, a Quakers Hill parishioner, who is providing us with extensive assistance and expert advice.

- And, given the issues we've encountered with the SPC roof, the Finance Committee have elected to have the SMC roof inspected and for any necessary repairs/improvement works to be carried out. The roof will also be thoroughly cleaned.
- Please refer to the 'Church Maintenance Update' section of the bulletin each week for the latest news on this and any other maintenance matters affecting our parish.

OUR TOP 3 PRESSING NEEDS / FINANCIAL ISSUES

- Whilst the resolution to the SPC roof issue is almost at hand, our biggest financial issue is now the sizeable debt that we will carry over the next few decades. Whilst we have taken the maximum loan term available to us (to minimise our monthly repayments) we will endeavor to reduce this debt through ongoing fund-raising events and requests for donations.
- Our church car parks continue to be things that we need to keep an eye on, with regards to their upkeep and safety. We will be working closer with both schools in sharing this responsibility and cost going forward given their substantial use of both facilities. Resolving the SPC roof issue has meant that we haven't been able to undertake other much needed works around the parish such as, for the installation of both fencing and CCTV (with the aim of reducing the incidences of vandalism) and to substantial improvements to our car parks, for example.
- A change of insurer by the Diocese meant that our yearly premium of \$75k due as of 1 February 2024 could no longer be paid monthly by us, but rather, had to be paid in full within 30 days of receipt of the bill. We chose to pay this years' bill using funds from our Term Deposit, as against borrowing the amount and paying interest on top. The need to pay the insurance bill within 90 days of receiving the bill going forward will be an ongoing thing, as will the likelihood of the premium amount increasing each year.

FINANCIAL YEAR 2023 / 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- The 'Collections / Planned Giving Appeal' made by Michael Zerafa at all Masses over the weekend of 29-30 June 2024 saw a modest increase in the amounts being given to both collections as well as a small uptake in Planned Giving contributors.
- We received a total of \$7,500 Government Volunteers Grants which were used to purchase laptops and a TV screen for the Parish Meeting Room.
- Sales through our Piety Stores have contributed \$19k net to our parish. Thank you to anyone who purchased something and to those who are involved in this Ministry.
- The Parish Audit for 2024 was completed and gave our financial administration a tick of approval.
- We held 3 different Parish Movie Nights at Hoyts Blacktown. They were well-supported, and we were able to raise \$10,946.
- We donated \$5k to our sister Parish St Anthony de Padua, Nissan Island, Bougainville, PNG but have decided to now cease this relationship given that they've repaired their roof, and that Fr Regie, who established the relationship, has left our parish.

It's all very much appreciated!

- And, finally, thank you to all currently serving members of the **Parish Finance Committee** for your continued efforts and support. A big thank you to Col Morris, John Kurmann, Bill Callaghan and Jojo Stamati who have stepped down this year and to Kiran Saldanha, Raphael Saccasan, Glenda Sergio and Angelica Green who have now joined the committee since. 


