First Sunday of Advent

"Stay awake! For you do not know when your Lord will come." Matthew 24: 37-44

Advent was included in the Church's calendar as a period of reflection intended to engage the Christian in giving attention to the significance of the fact that, in the person of Jesus, God demonstrated unequivocal solidarity and identification with all of humanity. Two words which occur again and again in the prayers and readings of Advent are "Emmanuel" and "incarnation". Emmanuel is one of the names attributed to Jesus and literally means "God with us". It first appears in the Bible in the prophesy of Isaiah, who proclaimed how Jesus would be born as a child and take a place in human history. In a prophesy to Ahaz, Isaiah declared: "Watch for this: A girl who is a virgin will become pregnant. She'll bear a son and name him Immanuel (God-With-Us)" (Isaiah 7:14). We will have to wait till the Fourth Sunday of Advent to hear that reading.

"Incarnation" is a word that is rarely used outside the context of religion. It is derived from the past participle of the Latin verb *incarnare*, which means "to make/ become flesh". From about the year 1300, the noun incarnation was used quite specifically to mean "the embodiment of God in the person of Jesus Christ" (Chambers, *Dictionary of Etymology*, p. 517, Harrap Publishers, N.Y. 1988). The word also appears in the flower name carnation, flesh colour. Advent invites us to reflect on the enormity of how God touched humanity in the person of Jesus and how, as a consequence, we are able to encounter Jesus in and through our human experiences. The prominent Catholic theologian and Bishop of Alexandria, Athanasius (c.295-375) wrote a treatise on the Incarnation entitled *De Incarnatione*, in which he stated: "God became like us so that we might become like him." (*sic*). The implication of this is that Jesus grew and developed through childhood, adolescence and adulthood like every other male. He asked the kind of questions about his origins and development as everyone one of us has asked. He had to learn how to befriend his body and make his way through the challenges and traumas of adolescence as every other adolescent has. He had to deal with the whole gamut of human emotions within himself and in everyone he encountered. He experienced grief and rejection, loss and acceptance, illness, suffering and the depravity of humiliation, torture and execution of the kind experienced only by a minority. And he died as we all must.

Regrettably, Advent in the world we know has almost become a non-event. The world of retail commerce has already begun selling for Christmas, and Christmas carols can be heard already in shopping malls the world over. For any of us to set aside time for Advent prayer and reflection requires special effort and discipline.

God's incarnation in human flesh in the person of Jesus not only points to the value and dignity of human flesh and blood - the fact that Jesus adopted our human flesh and blood implies that - but it suggests that this is worth celebrating. In today's reading from Romans, however, the human body seems to be the object of some severe criticism. The problem we face here is that the Greek word for flesh used in Romans can have two meanings. Sometimes flesh is equated with our *sinful nature*, while at other times it is used to refer to our human condition, worthy of our reverence and admiration, despite its fragility. The fact that God, in the person of Jesus, has identified in the incarnation with our flesh, in the sense of something to be revered, gives us every reason to celebrate. At the same time, we all know the guilt and disappointment we experience when we let bodily urges and desires get out of control, when we fail to treat our bodies with reverence, respect and self-control. But that does not mean that there is something about our bodies of which we should be ashamed or embarrassed. We, with our bodies, talents and emotional life, are gifts from God. It's important that we stop from time to time to remind ourselves that all of God's gifts are good, and, as such, worthy of respect and reverence. We also know that gifts can be misused, and today's reading from *Romans* is simply a reminder to us to use our gifts for the purpose for which they are intended.

Today's first reading from Isaiah holds up to us a vision of peace and co-operation among peoples. It's more than a vision for a hope-filled future; it's a vision for a future to the building of which we can contribute by being peace-makers among those beside whom we live, work and minister. While Advent is a time in our Church calendar during which we prepare to celebrate, yet again, the birth of the Christ Child into our midst, we also take time to recall that he had come to usher in an era of peace and a new way of living with one another, a way of living which he called the Kingdom of God.

Isn't that something of which our world is in desperate need? We all long and hope for warring parties in the Sudan and in Ukraine to settle their differences. We pray for a cessation of the barbarity in Nigeria where innocent girls are being kidnapped and used as bargaining chips. And in Australia we stand horrified at attempts to revive the evils of Nazism and at the violence to which migrants and refugees are being subjected. Happenings like these might lead us to wonder if the Second Coming of Christ is just around the corner.

However, the vision proposed by Isaiah, together with the gospel-reading from Matthew assures us that God has a future in store for us but that it will come in unexpected ways. The event of the birth of Jesus which we are preparing in Advent to celebrate is an assurance that Jesus, the greatest personification we have of God's love, is already dwelling among us and that we need to keep ourselves awake to that reality. Only our alertness to that reality will help us to realise that every day of our lives provides us with opportunity to participate in making our part of the world all that it can be. - a place where we and our sisters and brothers can live in peace, free from fear and buoyed by hope, confident that Christ will come again to transform all of creation to what it is meant to be.

Is the Church a Chat Room?

The church is not an ordinary hall but a sacred space where heaven touches earth. When we enter, we step into the house of God, like Moses before the burning bush, who was told to remove his sandals for the ground was holy (Exodus 3:5). The Lord truly dwells among us in the Blessed Sacrament; thus, our hearts and tongues must show reverence.

Saint John Chrysostom reminds us that to pray well is to stand with awe before the Majesty of God. Likewise, Saint Teresa of Ávila says, "There is no need for loud talking in prayer; God hears even the very movement of our lips." When idle chatter fills the church, reverence fades, distractions multiply, and others are hindered from entering personal prayer or quiet preparation for Mass.

The Catechism teaches that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of our Christian life," and such a mystery calls for interior silence and holy attention. Conversation and greetings have their rightful place, our foyers, morning tea rooms, and parish gatherings are perfect settings for that joyful exchange.

In church, let our words be few and our focus on Christ present in the tabernacle. Silence becomes our offering; reverence becomes our witness

Our parish needs to generate \$45k per month of income to meet our obligations and expenses. At present we generate an average of \$61k per month, a surplus of \$16k per month, which is wonderful, so thank you. Our yearly insurance premium alone was \$72,800 as of 1 March 2025.

* Parramatta Catholic Foundation (PCF) – Our PCF quota for 2024/2025 was \$35,477.16 & donations received to 30 June 25 were \$43,200.15, so, we were \$7,722.99 in credit. This amount will go towards our 2025/2026 liability. Candle money from both our churches is used by us to reduce this debt, so thank you to everyone who purchases these.

MQOF INVESTMENT PROPERTIES – 9 properties owned in total

- Net rental income generated for the 2024/2025 F/YR was \$207,883 as compared to \$197,776 in the 2023/2024 F/YR. All rents were increased throughout the financial year.
- All of our investment properties were leased as of the close of business on 30 June 2025.
- The Syro-Malabar community are paying \$1,500 per month to use SMC and a further \$200 a month for use of the garage there.
- The cost of maintaining these properties continues to be an issue for us due to the age of the buildings. A total of \$25k was outlaid on maintenance works on our properties over the year, including \$15k alone on the property at 64 Orwell St.

UPDATE ON THE REPAIRS TO THE ST PATRICK'S CHURCH (SPC) ROOF

- During the year, our application to the Diocese to spend up to \$600,000, if needed, and to borrow \$400,000 over the maximum repayment term available to us, was approved by the Diocesan Property Council, the Diocesan Finance Committee and the College of Consultors. Repair work on the SPC roof commenced on 18 March, and, whilst the repairs (both externally and internally) are now nearing completion, the delays in completing the same, due to the continuous wet weather we encountered (and therefore, falling outside the control of GS Design + Construct who are undertaking the repairs) has meant that, the final cost of the same will now increase, beyond what was originally quoted, being \$506,605. The exact amount of the difference is yet to be advised to us, but we will have no choice but to incur this. As at the date of this report, \$325,924 has been paid to the company for works carried out to date and we have drawn down \$50k of the loan funds available to us, leaving us \$350k further to draw down on, if needed. A total of \$275k in parish funds has been used towards the cost of repairs and the \$85k received by us as part of our previous insurance claim, will be put towards the costs of the internal repairs, as is required under the payment of that claim.
- As advised in last year's report, the 'Raise the Roof Appeal' was withdrawn, with all donations made to the parish by means of the Second Collection and Planned Giving etc. now going towards meeting the development and maintenance needs of the parish, which, of course, includes repayments to the Diocese for our increased loan/debt.
- Continued thanks go to Bruce Moa, a Quakers Hill parishioner, who has been project managing the repairs to the roof on our behalf, at a very reasonable cost to us.
- GS Design + Construct will give us a 15-year warranty on the repair work and will also undertake to do inspections for us every 5 years (and to do any necessary touch-ups as necessary at the time, at our expense).
- It was agreed that solar panels will not be installed on the SPC roof once repairs are finalised, unlike what we did at SMC.
- Given the issues we encountered with the SPC roof, the Finance Committee had previously elected to have the SMC roof inspected and for any necessary repairs / improvement works to be carried out. This project will commence once the SPC roof repairs are finalised and will also be carried out by GS Design + Construct.
- Please refer to the 'Church Maintenance Update' section of the bulletin each week for the latest news on this and any other maintenance matters affecting our parish.

OUR TOP 4 PRESSING NEEDS / FINANCIAL ISSUES

- After drawing down on the loan funds available to us to cover the costs of the repairs to the SPC roof, our loan debt (as of the date of this report) is \$190,351. And, whilst we have taken the maximum loan term available to us to minimise our monthly repayments, we will now need to endeavor to reduce this debt through your ongoing generosity, by supporting our Planned Giving and attending future fund-raising events.

- Our church car parks are in constant need of repair, especially with regards to potholes. We have always stated that both our parish schools should contribute towards the costs of such repairs due to the traffic they generate during school drop-offs and pick-ups. You'll be pleased to know that a 'Memorandum of Agreement' that now stands between the Catholic Schools Diocese of Parramatta (CSPD) and the parish now means that the cost of any repairs carried out, instigated by us, or not, are now paid at the following ratios: for the SPC car park (97% CSPD & 3% Parish) and, for the SMC car park (42% CSPD & 58% Parish). We are also obtaining updated quotes for the cost of fully restoring both car parks now that this agreement is in place, for future discussion and consideration.
- Our yearly insurance premium of \$72,800 which was due to be paid as of 1 March 2025 was, once again, paid in full by our parish, without the need to use the special loan facility, which is available to all parishes through the Diocese. Using this facility entails the payment of interest, and so, we have saved money as a parish by not doing so. We will once again need to be prepared for next year's premium, which will undoubtedly be higher. Imagine getting a bill like this each year! But the reality is that if we don't pay this bill each year, we simply can't open the doors to both of our churches.
- Following a security/vandalism incident in the SPC car park it was highly recommended by both the Chief Police Officer at Parramatta and the Diocese that we install security gates along the Allawah Street frontage to the SPC. The quotes for this work range from \$35k to \$44k. We also need to repair the entrance doors at SPC at a cost of \$42,000. We will seek to apply for a Government Grant to try and cover these costs once such a grant becomes available.

FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025 HIGHLIGHTS

- The 'Collections / Planned Giving Appeal' was made by members of the Finance Committee at all Masses over the weekend of 21-22 June 2025, including the Sudanese Mass for the first time, and, at the Filipino Mass that was held that Sunday. We saw a modest increase in the amounts being given to both collections and 8 new parishioners joined up to Planned Giving bringing the total amount of parishioners committed to Planned Giving via envelopes and electronic giving up to 496 (of which 149 are using envelopes). It also resulted in seeing the Second Collection from the Sudanese Mass being put towards the support of the parish going forward. Previously it was staying with the community for their use and administration.
- We paid our yearly insurance bill of \$72,800 in full, in March, without the need to use the special loan facility available through the Diocese (as was previously mentioned).
- Our application for a 'Safe Places for Faith Communities' Grant was successful and saw us receive a Government Grant of \$36,869 which was put towards the installation of CCTV cameras at both of our churches. The cost of the installation was \$42,000, meaning that we only had to use \$5,131 of actual parish funds to complete this project. Special thanks go to Raphael Saccasan and Sarah for putting together the application, and to Dianne Wigan from the Diocese for her assistance in reviewing our submission.
- Sales through our Piety Stores have contributed \$21k net to our parish. Thank you to anyone who purchased something and to those who are involved in this Ministry.
- The Parish Audit for 2025 has been completed and gave our financial administration a tick of approval, with no issues highlighted.
- We raised an amazing \$29,000 during our Parish Feast Day activities, which celebrated the 10th Anniversary of 'Mary Queen of the Family' as a parish. \$23,000 of this was raised through sponsors who advertised through our Souvenir Booklet, which, coincidentally, cost us \$7,500 to print. A further \$6,000 was raised through the raffle. A huge thank you to the organising committee and to the sponsors for their generosity and support. Thanks also to those of you who participated in the Feast Day activities.
- All Tap'n'Go Terminals were replaced by new CommBank Terminals and are now consistent across both churches, allowing you to easily make donations of \$5, \$10, \$20 or 'Other' amounts. From 1 July 2025, all donations made via these machines are now apportioned 30 cents to the First Collection and 70 cents to the Second Collection, except when being used at Fund-raising events, like the Parish Golf Day.

- A 'Property & Maintenance (P&M) Committee' has been established at the request of Fr Wim (as a sub-committee of the FC) and committee member, Frederick Brillo, has agreed to chair this committee. Parishioner, Ray Francica has also agreed to join them. Thank you to both Frederick and Ray!
- Our 'Sister Parish' relationship with St Anthony de Padua parish on Nissan Island, in Bougainville, PNG was ended. This relationship had been set up by Fr Regie whilst he was our Parish Priest (PP) as the PP at the sister parish was also an MSP Priest. Our parish had made several donations to the sister parish over the years, including \$5k in the previous financial year but, efforts to get reports and photos from them, to present to our parishioners at a Mass and then hold a Special Collection, failed to eventuate. The sister parish had their own roof issue to resolve which was one of the main reasons we offered to assist them. We wish the parish all the very best going forward.

It also allows the parish to better plan for our future knowing what's coming in each week.
- Thank you also to **Father Wim and our Clergy Team, to Sarah, our Business Manager** for her prudent management of the parish's finances and assets, to **our Admin Team, to our Collectors** at all of our Masses for your service to this ministry each week, and, to all those who have assisted with, or sponsored, our Fundraising Events, such as the Parish Golf Day, our Feast Day and Christmas Gala. It's all very much appreciated!
- A special word of thanks goes to **Ged Oblea** for all the assistance he rendered to me and the Finance Committee over the years he was with us, and especially when it came to the Parish Golf Day. Ged is now working at Marsden Park Parish, closer to his home.
- A big thank you also to our generous **Parish Bulletin Advertisers. Please support these businesses that support us.**
- And, finally, thank you to all currently serving members of the **Parish Finance Committee** for your continued efforts and support including Father's Wim, Andrew and Stephen, Deacon John, Sarah, Reagan and Kiran. A big thank you also to Cita Correa, Raphael Saccasan, Glenda Sergio and Angelica Green, who served on the committee for part of the financial year but, who had to step down due to a change in their circumstances/work commitments, and, in the case of Raph, due to him moving away from the area. And, lastly, an extra special thanks to Anita Cvitkovic, Frederick Brillo, Cholly Paderanga and Angeline Sandrakumar, who have since volunteered to join the committee. Welcome!

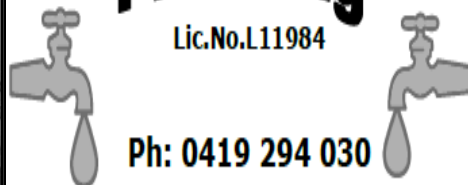

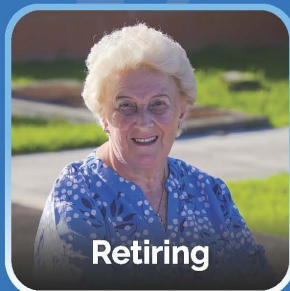
