21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus said to his disciples: "But you, who do you say I am?" Simon Peter answered: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And Jesus replied: "Blessed are you, Simon, son of Jonah, for it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. And so, I now say to you: You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church."

Matthew 16: 13-20

The readings for this twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time offer us a number of insights and associated challenges. In the lead-up to today's first reading from Isaiah is an account of how God dismissed Shebna from his position of "Master of King Hezekiah's Palace" and replaced him with Eliakim, whose name meant "God establishes stability". Shebna was so full of his own importance that he had a large tomb built for himself in a prominent, high place. The irony was that he was killed and made ready for his tomb much sooner than he anticipated. His position as "Master of the King's Palace" was handed to Eliakim, who was endowed with supreme authority, with power to grant and deny access to the king. Isaiah spoke of God's placing on Eliakim's shoulder "the key of the House of David" and shaping him as "a peg" to hold firm and bolster the kingdom over which he was appointed as Prime Minister. Isaiah attributed to God a reference to Eliakim in the third person but made it clear that he was appointed by God: "Should he open, no one will close, should he close, no one shall open." (Isaiah 22: 22) In today's gospel-reading, we hear an echo of these words of God about Eliakim. They are to be found in Jesus' endorsement of Peter following his recognition of Jesus as Messiah: "You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth will be considered loosed in heaven." (Matthew 16: 18-19)

A message that emerges clearly from The Gospel of Matthew is that Jesus' disciples took a considerable amount of time to come to a realisation of just who Jesus was. Some of them would have heard accounts of the voice from heaven that was heard when John baptised Jesus in the Jordan: "This is my Son, the Beloved, my favour rests on him." (Matthew 3:17) All of the disciples would have heard of how the Baptist had identified Jesus: "The next day, seeing Jesus coming towards him, John said: 'Look, there's the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. This is the one I spoke of when I said: A man is coming after me, who ranks before me because he existed before me. I did not know him myself, and yet it was to reveal him to Israel that I came baptising with water.' John also declared: 'I saw the Spirit coming down on him from heaven like a dove and resting on him...' (John 1: 29-32). From the time the disciples started following him, they saw how he cured the sick and disabled and cast out devils. They had also witnessed how he had fed a crowd numbering "about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children" from five loaves and two fish (Matthew 14: 21) and, shortly afterwards, saved Peter from drowning and calmed the sea and stilled the wind. (Matthew 14:32) It was only then that the disciples in the boat acknowledged him for who he was: "Truly, you are the Son of God." (Matthew 14:33)

Today's gospel-reading complements this one, which we heard two weeks ago on the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The event which Matthew describes here is located in the city of Caesarea Philippi, built by Herod's son Phillip who had been appointed as ruler of Northern Palestine. Phillip named the city after himself and Caesar, to whom divine status had been attributed. What's more, the city had become home to a panoply of temples and religions. So, it was not by coincidence that Jesus had selected this city as the location in which his role and identity of Messiah might be clear. (Cont'd next page...)

Jesus opened the conversation with his disciples with a non-threatening question about the gossip his disciples might have heard around the traps as to who he was. They responded with a list of the names of prophets who were thought to have come back from the dead. But when Jesus turned the tables on them and effectively asked: "Well, what do you make of me? Who, do you think, I am?" they probably felt like sinking into the ground beneath them. But Peter, noted for his rashness, rescued them all with: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

The episode contained in today's gospel-reading confirms that part of the human journey consists in growing into our understanding and appreciation of the vocation we choose under the guidance and inspiration of God's Spirit. That requires openness to God's Spirit and time for prayer, reflection and discernment leading to ongoing commitment to living the choice we make.

But that is not the whole story. That Jesus confirmed Simon Peter in leadership is testimony to the fact that he does not require those he appoints to leadership to be paragons of perfection. He was clearly stating that even though human frailty can sometimes mar the efforts, not only of leaders but of all of us would-be disciples, God's power can lift us out of our mistakes and regenerate us to reach out to all around us with compassion, mercy, forgiveness and tolerance.

GOSPEL: Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary, 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

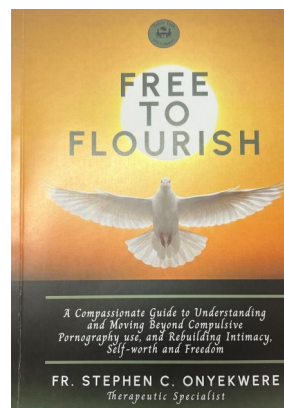

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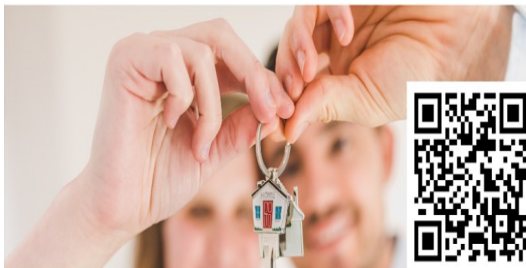


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
